Circuit Court.

Judges Moore and Irion, the able dispensers of justice in this court, arrived in Colfax in the afternoon of Monday, July 24th. There were but two cases before them, which were disposed of as follows:

Wallace & Hamlin vs. W. S. Johnson et al.—Ordered that the judgment of the lower court be annulled, reversed and annulled, and that plaintiff's demand be rejected and their suit dismissed, the right of plaintiffs to sue defendant individually being specially reserved.

C. H. Teal et al vs. T. J. Pirtle (steamboat case)—Ordered that appeal be dismissed, as having been brought up without a valid order from the district court, and that the right of appellant (Pirtle) to apply by petition to district judge for an appeal to this court be reserved to him.


