A Trip to New Orleans.

At the request of Mr. A. A. Dean we publish the following letter, which was written to him by his younger brother, B. C. Dean, a cadet at the State University. It was not written for publication, but merely to give his brother an idea of his trip. As it is a pretty fair sample of composition, with but few errors, we take pleasure in putting Master Buck in print:

Preparations for our visit were begun six weeks before leaving the University. During this time we drilled constantly, no one being absent from roll call. The President ordered the corps of cadets to be assembled early one morning for the purpose of finding out whether each one had provided himself with the necessary garments, knapsacks and belts. The day we left the University will long be remembered by me. It was one cold and dreary morning in the month of February. We met at the wharf the steamer E. J. Gay, on which we were to make our trip. The Gay left the wharf shortly after our getting aboard, and a few minutes later we were sailing on the waters of the Mississippi. It rained the greater part of the morning, and was quite chilly and windy, consequently we were compelled to stay inside the cabin. By one o'clock we made the trip as far as Plaquemine, a flourishing town on the right bank of the Mississippi, and arrived at Donaldsonville just as the sun was setting. I stood looking at it until it was quite lost. What a glorious sight! The clouds were tinged with purple and crimson and yellow of all shades, and the clear sky varied from blue to a fine green at the horizon. I think the sun appears twice as large just as it sets as when over head. The Gay moved swiftly onward, yet slowly we all thought, because each one of us was filled with eager expectations. At twelve o'clock we passed the Exposition grounds, about four miles above

New Orleans. The electric light had begun to show up brilliantly in the distance, and on both sides ships and vessels of all kinds were seen. Swiftly the boat traveled, and at one o'clock we landed at the foot of Canal street. After all the passengers got off we proceeded to the steamer Clinton. This boat was not a great distance off, however we were almost worn out. Going aboard, the President ascertained that all state rooms were occupied. Finding out this news, we all laid down on the floor to sleep, but no one slept that night, and while I was thus engaged I thought myself a poor soldier. We were all up early the next morning, preparing for our day's march. Having eaten our breakfast at half past seven o'clock, we were ready to start on the march by nine. Going directly to the Washington Artillery hall, we were pleased to meet Rex, the King of the Carnival. After a short time we returned to the wharf. Rex and his escorts were also along, and we all went aboard the steamer Ed. Richardson, for the Exposition. The voices of people were heard on all sides, the roaring of cannons sounded and resounded, and the tags and ferry boats with their whistles added much to the racket. The wharf, the steamboats and the galleries were lined with people. The King was saluted everywhere on his way to the Exposition, and the men-of-war, with their revolving cannons and improved guns, kept up one continuous fire. Landing at the Exposition grounds at four o'clock we marched directly to the music hall in the main building where Rex and his retinue were welcomed by the host present. The Mexican Band, composed of seventy-five musicians, furnished some rare music on the occasion. Just as we left music hall they played "Dixie," which caused applause to be sounded throughout the building. Some of the exhibits we tried to examine, but had to take a quick look and pass on, not having the time to scrutinize closely. Thus ended two pleasantly spent days, one in going to the city, the other escorting the King to the Exposition. B. C. DEAN.
