The suit is styled Wash B. Adams vs. W. P. Guyne et al., and the other parties named are C. M. Brannon, I. J. Rhinehart, H. P. Gray, G. W. Gray, Frank Hamilton, Huey Hamilton, Roy Hamilton, Hugo Dupuy, A. H. Butler, Otto Brown, Ketchum Thompson, Jem Jones, William Pharis and W. P. Robinson.

Ordinance No. — ordering an election to be held in district No. 21.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Grant parish, in regular session convened, that there be and is hereby ordered an election in district No. 21, to take the census of the legally qualified voters of said district upon the question of voting a special five mill tax upon all taxable property situated in said district, both personal and real, in addition to all other taxes levied for other purposes, for the purpose of education.

Be it further ordained, etc., that said election be held in district No. 21, at the place where the last general election was held, and that said election be held on Tuesday May 16, 1905.

Be it further ordained, etc., that said election shall be by printed ballot, and shall contain the words "For the five mill tax," and "Against the five mill tax," and shall be held according to the general election laws of the State.
