

The Lumber Monopoly.

Senator Kittredge, of South Dakota, is a Republican and therefore a protectionist, but he is not a hide-bound standpatter and apologist for the robbery and extortion which are committed under the shelter of the Dingley tariff schedules. His speech in the senate the other day was a scathing arraignment of the lumber trust that has taken the people of the Northwest by the throat and compels them to pay outrageously high prices for one of the necessities of life, for such lumber is admitted to be.

Mr. Kittredge denounced the Lumber Trust as one of the vilest and cruelest of the trusts now plundering the people of this country, for it has secured practically a monopoly of the entire lumber product of the United States, and is absolutely remorseless in its greed for within the last three or four years lumber has been advanced to the farmers of the Northwest from 100 to 500 per cent.

He had no hesitancy in saying that the remedy for such an outrageous condition is to at once take the duty off lumber in order that the great stores of that product, with which the markets of Canada are glutted may be imported into the United States to break the monopoly that now exists. There is no doubt that there are many Republicans in Congress who in their hearts feel that this should be done for the relief of the people, but they dare not go against the will of their standpatter leaders, for the latter have announced that no sacrilegious hand must be laid on the sacred tariff.

There is not the least reason to hope that the standpatters are going to pay any attention to Senator Kittredge's earnest plea for the farmers of the Northwest from the extortion of the Lumber Trust. The Washington Post knows whereof it speaks, when it declared that the Republican Congress no more intends to give South Dakota free lumber than they propose to give South Carolina free trade chains. It would be foolish to doubt the truth of the Post's observation, because the beneficiaries of the Dingley schedules realize that if they do not all stand together in their plundering operations they will all fall together. They are quite well aware of the fact that if lumber were put on the free list, every saw mill owner in the Northwest would resent the action by leaving the Republican party and carrying his friends with him. Therefore no matter how the people may suffer, no matter how mercilessly they may be robbed, nothing must be done that will endanger the supremacy of the Republican party in the nation for upon it depends the existence of the great plunderbund tariff has created.—N. O. Daily States Feb. 2.
