Tick Eradication Resumed.

The Bureau of Animal Industry of the U. S. Department of Agriculture is resuming active operations for the eradication of the cattle ticks which prevail in the southern part of the country and transmit the contagion of Texas-fever of cattle. Its men are being sent into the field and preparations are being made to push the work of extermination vigorously during the warm weather, when the ticks are most active.

Since this work was begun two years ago an area of about 56,000 square miles, or almost the size of the State of Georgia, has been freed from the ticks. As a result the quarantine on southern cattle has been either modified or entirely removed from this area. Last year work was done to a greater or less extent in the States of Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Louisiana, Texas, and California, and it is proposed this year to continue in the same States with the addition of a small portion of Mississippi. Most of the work has been and will continue to be done in sections contiguous to the quarantine line, the object being to push the line farther south from year to year; but encouragement is given to local work in any part of the quarantine district in the assurance that when any considerable area is rendered tick free it will be released from quarantine.

The work is being done by co-operation between the Federal government and the State and local authorities. Congress has appropriated \$250,000 for the year beginning July 1, and it is expected that the States and counties where the work is carried on will duplicate this sum. The committee on appropriations of the House of Representatives expressed itself very strongly to the effect that the States should bear a reasonable share of the cost and that the Federal work should be mainly confined to States where co-operation is received.

Various methods of exterminating the ticks are used, including transferring the cattle from pasture to pasture at suitable intervals, and dipping, spraying, and hand dressing the cattle with oil and oil emulsion. In sections where there are large herds and large ranches dipping on a large scale is practiced, either alone or in connection with pasture rotation, while in other sections, where the cattle on some farms frequently consist only of a cow or an ox team, hand dressing with oil is found to be the only practicable method.

The damage caused by the ticks and the benefits to follow from their eradication are not generally appreciated. It is estimated that the Texas-fever tick is responsible for about \$40,000,000 of loss annually to the people of the infected country, and that it also lowers the assets of the South by an additional \$23,250,000, making the enormous aggregate of \$63,250,000. To wipe out this heavy loss is the object of the work now under way, and the results already accomplished leave no doubt that success is possible, though a number of years will be required for the completion of the undertaking. Much depends upon the cattle owners, who can either hasten or retard progress according as they cooperate or refuse to assist in the work.

Literature giving full information as to the ticks, the disease which they transmit, and methods for their eradication has been issued by the Department of Agriculture and will be supplied free of charge on application to the Chief of the Bureau of Animal Industry, Washington, D. C.

Three Floods in the Year 1849.

The following account, from the Alexandria Town Talk, is of special interest in view of the present high water, which is the highest flood in Red river for 16 years:

Mr. P. B. Compton, in 1892, handed the Town Talk for examination a weather and river report kept by Maj. P. G. Voorhies, when he resided on his plantation on Red river just below Alexandria. The record commences in Jan. 1848, and runs daily to Feb. 28, 1851, out the record of the river in August, 1849, is not given, as Major Voorhies had to leave his plantation dwelling and seek higher ground, on account of the extreme flood that month.

We learn from the old and well kept record, that Red river was very high in February, 1849. Before that year, the highest record from which a mark could be taken was in 1844.

On Monday, Feb. 12, 1849, the river reached a point 5 inches above the high water of 1844, and commenced falling on February 13, 1849. The river remained bank full through the months of March, April, May, June, July and August. It was on Friday the 17th of August, 1849, that Red river reached the highest stage of which there is any record. It went 13 inches above the flood of February, 1849, and 18 inches above the great flood of 1844.

On August 18, 1849, Maj. Voorhies moved from his plantation to the pinewoods and said that "all is overflowed."

On Aug. 25, 1849, Maj. Voorhies and "his boy" moved back to the plantation home.

It will be noticed that in 1849, Red river had three great floods. The river commenced to rise in December, 1848, and gradually got higher and higher, until the big flood of Feb. 1849, and after that remained bank full until the big flood in August, that year.

The condition of the river from December, 1891, up to June, 1892, was very similar to that of the years 1848-49.

Here is the record by months: Rise in Dec. 1848, 15 feet 8 inches; rise in Jan. 1849, 8 feet 2 inches; rise in Feb. to 12th, 5 inches above high water of 1844. During March the river fell, from the extreme height reached in Feb. 6 feet 11 inches. On April 31st the river was 9 feet 6 inches below the high water of February. On June 30th the river was 5 feet 2 inches below the high stage of February. On the 31st of July the river was 1 foot 6 inches below the flood of Feb. 1849. This shows that Red river was very high from Dec. 1848 to August 1849, about eight months.

The rain fall in 1849 here was as follows; Jan. 5 and 6-10 inches, Feb. 2 and 8-10th inches, March 4 and 1-10th inches, April 4 and 1-10th inches, May 10 and 2-10th inches, June 4 and 2-10th inches, July 6 and 2-10th inches, August 6 and 6-10th inches, September 2 inches, October 7 and 9-10th inches, November 7 and 7-10th inches. Total for the year 77 inches.

Strange to say, the river in December, 1849, lacked only 1 foot 8 inches of being as high as it was during August that year. So it can be said that Red river was in flood three times during 1849—in February, August and September.

The newly elected council met pursuant to the following call, to-wit:

There will be a called meeting of the town council of Colfax, to be held at the town hall at 8 p. m. this day, for the purpose of organizing the new council, to elect a secretary and treasurer, to fix the bond of treasurer and marshal and to fix the salary of the secretary and treasurer, the mayor and the marshal, to appoint street commissioners.

The mayor and board of aldermen met with Mayor R. S. Cameron, presiding. Present Aldermen, McKnight, Carnahan, O'Quinn and Williams. Absent, LeSage.

J. A. Williams was made temporary secretary, and then the retiring mayor, R. S. Cameron, turned over to the incoming mayor, J. P. Kelsoe, the books, keys and authority as mayor of the town, J. P. Kelsoe assuming authority and commenced to preside as mayor.

C. N. Carnahan nominated J. A. Williams as secretary and treasurer. J. W. O'Quinn nominated G. H. McKnight as secretary and treasurer.

The name of McKnight was withdrawn, and J. A. Williams was elected as secretary and treasurer, and his salary as such fixed at the sum of seventy-five dollars per annum, payable quarterly.

J. A. Williams was elected as town attorney at a salary of fifty dollars per annum, payable quarterly.

The salary of the mayor was fixed at the sum of seventy-five dollars per annum, payable quarterly.

The marshal's salary was fixed at the sum of forty-five dollars per month, payable monthly and in addition to receive five per cent on all collections, except fines imposed in mayor's court.

The bond of the marshal and treasurer was each fixed at \$800.

The mayor appointed the following street commissioners, to-wit: G. H. McKnight, J. W. O'Quinn and A. M. LeSage, with McKnight as chairman thereof.

The chairman ordered paid fifty dollars per annum as a salary for his services as chairman of street commissioners.

G. H. McKnight allowed and ordered paid the sum of fifty dollars for his excellent work done on the streets during the past year, and his personal supervision of the work which has been done.

The following resolution was offered by C. N. Carnahan and unanimously adopted:

Be it resolved by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the town of Colfax in special session convened, That we do most earnestly appreciate the work done by the retiring mayor, R. S. Cameron, in the interest of the town of Colfax. We believe that he has done all that the executive officer could do in serving the best interest of the town affairs, and the preservation of good order in the town. That we do especially commend his good, prompt and efficient work in ridding the town of gamblers who had assembled here during the past year.—That we consider that he has made a good and valuable mayor and retire with the best will and feeling of the council who has served with him during the past two years as aldermen.

There being no further business the council adjourned until its next regular meeting on the night of the 1st Tuesday in July, 1908.
