Two Arrested in Newspaper Office Because of Shortage.

Toulman, cashier of the paper have been charged in affidavits filed in the city criminal court with embezzlement of \$2000 of the funds of the paper. The affidavit was sworn to by D. D. Moore, managing editor of the paper. Barrington, who is a young married man, has been in the employ of the Times-Democrat for twenty years, having begun his services as an office boy under the administration of the late Page M. Baker.

The alleged embezzlement of \$2000 covers a period of less than one month, and it is stated that the auditors have discovered a shortage of at least \$15,000. Barrington gave bond in the sum of \$2000. Toulman's bond was also fixed at \$2,000.

The "Ever on Time" Line

The Louisiana Annual Conference.

The Louisiana Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, which convened in Monroe on Wednesday of this week, has a warm place in this editor's heart because of its memories extending over a period of sixty years, from childhood to the present time. The editor's father was one of the men who helped to organize the Louisiana Conference in 1855, up to which time the jurisdiction of the Mississippi Conference extended over the Methodist preachers in Louisiana. The conference as it is at present organized, consists of six districts, about corresponding to the Congressional districts in the State, each under the supervision of a presiding elder. Any one of the present districts has about as many preachers in it as there were in the State when the conference was organized in 1855.

The conference at Monroe is presided over by Bishop Mouzon, and its session will last until next Monday morning, when the appointments will be read out. Many changes will be made among the preachers, the most of them hardly ever serving more than two years at one place, and none of them over four years. This is the distinctive feature of the Methodist itineracy, and every man is expected to hold himself in readiness to move into a new field whenever the Bishop and his cabinet so decide. Likewise the congregations are expected to prove loyal to any man sent to them, no matter how fond they may feel toward the departing pastor; but in many cases the congregations will show their grievance, because they do not feel that they are bound by the rule of stoicism that binds the preachers.
