#### Rhinehart's Victim a Desperado.

The man Reeves, who was shot and killed by Mr. I. J. Rhinehart in Grant parish some two weeks ago, was one of the most lawless "bad men" in the State, if current reports are true.

Deputy Sheriff Bob Young, of Catahoula parish, was in Jena last week and stated that he knew the man well, having been employed for some time on the government works at Harrisonburg. Mr. Young looks upon Reeves as a desperate character, and his opinion is concurred in by everyone in that community. Reeves had many difficulties with his fellow-workers, and on one occasion attempted to murder a foreman on the works. Mr. Young was detailed to arrest Reeves for this offense and while in pursuit of the man was waylaid, and only by chance, escaped assassination. Attorney S. R. Holstein, also of Harrisonburg, fully corroborated Mr. Young's testimony as to the murderous inclination of Reeves.

These are only a few of the lawless stunts pulled off by the desperado while in this section, and it would seem that Mr. Rhinehart has done the State and people a service by ridding the country of his presence. —Jena Times, June 21.

#### Southerners Warned to Stop Wholesale Exportation of Cattle.

A warning to the southern States, especially Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida, against the wholesale exportation of their cattle is contained in a special statement issued from Washington, D. C., June 14, by the bureau of animal industry of the Department of Agriculture.

In the past 12 months, says the statement, buyers from the middle west have taken from that district thousands of animals, many of which go to the slaughter house, when they should be retained for breeding purposes.

"Some people of the south," says the bureau, "seem glad that these cattle are being shipped out, as the number of scrub cattle is being reduced and the south will get better as the result. They do not consider that if the shortage of cattle is such as to cause buyers to come from the far west to buy these scrub cattle for breeding purposes the chances of southern farmers refilling their pastures with good cattle are indeed small, but where are these good breeding cattle to come from at a reasonable price?"

Colfax was represented at the Hargis barbecue and basket dinner by a turnout of eleven automobile loads of our citizens. Mrs. Wm. LaCroix, with Mr. Geo. C. Jordan as chauffeur, lead the procession, while Mr. Jac Bloch came in as a close second. The others were J. H. McNeely, W. A. Brownlee, J. W. Duncan, Earl Roberts, Jas. J. O'Quinn, Dr. E. H. Blackwood, Dr. E. B. Gray, C. E. Sancerant and M. L. Goins. They found the way a little rough in a couple of places, but all felt amply repaid for the trip. Three or four miles of the model road to Montgomery is not yet completed, and they had to travel by the old road that distance, and the big 100-foot washout of the abutment to the bridge across Nantachie bayou was another bad place. All of these defects will be remedied in a few days, as the contractor is now at work on them, and the entire road is being rushed to completion.

#### Ordinance Requiring Lights on Automobiles, Etc.

By Mr. Swafford—No. 1915. AN ORDINANCE

To provide for lights on automobiles, motorcycles and bicycles, and to regulate the use of same in the incorporate limits of the town of Colfax, La., and providing penalties for violation of said ordinance.

Section 1.—Be it ordained, by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the town of Colfax, La., in regular session convened. That, from and after thirty days publication of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any owner, or operative of any automobile, motorcycle, or bicycle, to run, or cause to be run, any such machines on any of the streets, within the incorporate limits of the town of Colfax, La., after dark without first providing, and attaching to front of such automobile, motorcycle or bicycle, light or lights of sufficient strength and reflection to be readily seen by any one approaching said machine from the front, and also all automobiles shall provide a red signal light on rear end of same sufficiently bright to warn any one approaching from the rear.

Section 2.—Be it further ordained, That any one violating this ordinance, or any part thereof, shall on conviction by the mayor, be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars, nor more than twenty five dollars, at the discretion of the Mayor, and in default of payment of fine, to be imprisoned in the town lockup for a period of not less than ten days nor more than twenty five days, subject to work on the streets.

Section 3.—Be it further ordained, That all laws, or parts of laws in conflict with this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

#### Proclamation of Election.

STATE OF LOUISIANA (PARISH OF GRANT.)

Colfax, La., May 27, 1913.

By virtue of the authority vested in us by law and in pursuance to the proclamation of his excellency Luther E. Hall, Governor of the State of Louisiana, we do hereby order an election of the qualified voters to be held in Ward Two in the parish of Grant, State of Louisiana, at the usual places for holding said elections in said ward and said parish of Grant, on Tuesday, July 8 A. D. 1913, said date being the Tuesday following the first Monday in said month.

The election so ordered to be held is for the purpose of electing the following officer, to-wit: First Justice of the Peace of Ward Two, Grant parish, La., to succeed Rufus A. Walker, Justice of the Peace, resigned.

Said election to be held in accordance with the general election laws of the State of Louisiana, and due returns thereof, made as the law directs.


