

A Statement from Mr. Lewis. Pollock, La., March 25, 1914. Editor Colfax Chronicle:

I notice in their report the grand jury charges the Lewis camp with not working but 5 to 10 days at a time, and only working 5 to 8 hours. I want to say that this charge is absolutely untrue, and the party or parties who went before the grand jury and made such a complaint, told an unqualified falsehood. I have been told that these complaints started while I was camped at Summerfield. While there I had several applicants to work, and because I didn't give them employment, I suppose they started this report. I work every day except rainy days and Sundays from 8 to 10 hours a day. I leave the camp in the morning at 7 o'clock and return at 6 o'clock in the evening. Sometimes we have to go five or six miles to work, and of course cannot put in ten hours actual work.

The report says that there are three men regularly employed and getting paid for straight time. This is also untrue. I employ only one man and pay him straight time, and he is the man I keep to assist me in keeping the convicts, and he works on the road also. I employ another man regularly, to do the dynamiting and to run the road machine, and pay him for the time he is in camp only. These men are my sons, and it is with the approval of the police jury that I employ them. I have been unable so far to secure the services of other men who can fill these places as they do.

The report charges that no account is kept of the expenses of the camp. This statement is not true. I have itemized duplicate bills of every purchase I have made for the camp since I took charge of it sixteen months ago, and can produce them if necessary. My bills have all been itemized. They have all been examined and approved by the police jury, and paid. I buy the most of the goods, groceries and feed stuff used in the camp from the Alexandria jobbers, and get the benefit of wholesale prices. I pay cash for them and by this means save the parish from 10 to 25 per cent. The police jury employed me on Dec. 1, 1912. I have been on the road, now, 16 months, and during this time have worked thirty-seven (37) different sections of roads, or a total of one hundred thirty-five (135) miles. The total expenses for operating the camp during this time is \$5460.00, an average of \$11.37 per day, or \$40.00 per mile. I am perfectly willing that my work and the expenses of the camp shall be compared with what has been done heretofore.

The people everywhere I have worked, with a very few exceptions, are well pleased with the work I have done. I would have been glad to have gone before the grand jury, if they had summoned me before them, and given me a chance to explain things, but someone seems to have had it in for the Lewis road camp, and I am forced to make this defense of myself. I could say more, but it would take a great deal of space in your paper, and I make this short statement, and deny every charge made against the road camp. I am willing to let the people judge for themselves, and I will produce the evidence if necessary to prove my statement. Respectfully,

State Board of Health Warns Dealers in Ice Cream. To Manufacturers and Dealers in Ice Cream:

Your attention is called to Food and Drug Regulation 29, which defines ice cream and fixes a standard for butter fat in these materials.

REGULATION 29. 1. Ice cream is a frozen product made from cream (or cream, milk and eggs) and sugar, with or without a natural flavoring, and may contain not to exceed one per cent of harmless filler, and shall contain not less than 10 per cent of butter fat.

2. Fruit ice cream is a frozen product made from cream (or cream, milk and eggs), sugar and sound, clean, mature fruits, which may contain not to exceed one per cent of harmless filler, and shall contain not less than 8 per cent of butter fat.

3. Nut ice cream is a frozen product made from cream (or cream, milk and eggs), sugar and sound, non-rancid nuts, which may contain not to exceed one per cent of harmless filler, and shall contain not less than 8 per cent of butter fat.

These standards were fixed after ice creams from reputable factories all over the State were analyzed, and represent the average of these analyses. It is believed that these standards are fair and that the enforcement of Regulation 29 will not work a hardship on the manufacturer. It was found necessary to make standards for ice creams as the food value was constantly being lowered by adulteration and use of the cheapest materials, thus encouraging low grade and insanitary manufacture.

We wish, therefore, to warn manufacturers and dealers that after April 1, 1914, a State-wide campaign will begin to enforce not only the chemical standards but the sanitary standards of production and handling of ice creams. The dealer can only secure protection by requiring the manufacturer to guarantee his goods to conform to all requirements of the Louisiana State Board of Health.
