Crimson Clover.

Crimson clover is a demonstrated success on practically every soil type in the South where the drainage is good. Its ability to succeed on nearly every kind of land in the cotton belt, makes it one of the best winter cover crops and soil builders for cultivated fields in this region.

Crimson clover gathers nitrogen from the air by means of a particular kind of bacteria that grow on its roots. If these bacteria are not present in the soil the clover will certainly be a failure. Hence, in seeding crimson clover on land where it has not previously been successfully grown, it is necessary to inoculate the land. Small quantities of inoculating bacteria may be had for demonstration purposes by applying to the U. S. Department of Agriculture or to your local agent.

The middles of a clean cultivated cotton field make an almost ideal seed bed for sowing crimson clover. The seed should be sown in this latitude about October 20, but the seed should not be sown until there is enough moisture in the ground and the sun is not too hot. Never less than fifteen pounds and preferably twenty pounds of seed per acre should be sown broadcast and harrowed in lightly with a harrow. Do not cover too deep.

Cotton seed and its products will certainly be high next spring, judging from present prices of seed. That will make cotton seed meal very expensive as a fertilizer. Crimson clover planted now will make a much better and a much cheaper fertilizer, especially for the sandy lands in the hills. Crimson clover has the power to collect and store nitrogen from the air in the plant at the rate of from 75 to 125 pounds per acre. Therefore, an acre of good crimson clover, where the entire crop is turned under, has the fertilizing value of 750 pounds of nitrate of soda, or 1800 pounds of cotton seed meal. If a ton of cotton seed meal is worth \$35.00 per ton (the present local price), an acre of crimson clover plowed under green should be worth an actual amount of \$32.50. This does not include the value of the decayed plants in the form of humus that is the most crying need in the sandy soils of the hills.

Crimson clover furnishes excellent grazing for all classes of livestock during the late winter and early spring. For this purpose it is much superior to rye, oats or any other non-leguminous winter cover crop. But remember that crimson clover is certain to be a failure unless the soil is inoculated. How the Candidates for Governor Stand On Prohibition.

THOS. C. BARRETT

"I favor immediate extension of the prohibition unit from the parish to the congressional district and providing for an election therein on the issuance of liquor license, as demanded by the people. I stand pledged to do all in my power to see that the question of state-wide prohibition is submitted to the electorate of the entire State for decision during my term of office as governor if elected. My position will be fully set forth in my platform, now in course of preparation."

RUFFIN G. PLEASANT.

"I favor local option with the parish as a unit. Should I be elected governor and the legislature passes a State-wide prohibition bill I would veto it. My reason will be given fully and frankly in my platform and public speeches."

A Synopsis of Barret's Platform.

- 1—Favors congressional district as local option unit and pledges himself to work for State-wide submission.
- 2—Declares saloons cost Louisiana \$37,000,000 annually and their banishment will result in reducing expenses of State by one-half. Says saloons are a liability and not an asset.
- 3—Opposes increasing tax rate and declares equalization of tax burdens will solve State's financial difficulties.
- 4—Would pursue liberal policy toward State asylums and charitable institutions.
- 5—Advocate more State aid for agricultural and industrial schools and favors textile training to encourage manufactures.
- 6—Subscribes to the doctrine of free schools, competent and properly paid teachers and free text books without necessity of a pauper oath.
- 7—Stands for wise and frugal laws in interest of industrial army of State.
- 8—Would abolish useless offices and boards in interest of economical administration of State, parish and municipality.
- 9—Favors changes in organic and statutory laws to insure justice in courts for rich or poor.
- 10—Favors State aid for good roads.
- 11—Stands for enforcement of present anti-trust laws and enactments to protect legitimate business interests of State.
- 12—Says primary laws should be rewritten and conducted at expense of the State so that man of limited means may aspire to office.
- 13—Would apply and enforce civil service law in cities of 5,000 or more population.
- 14—Finally submits his candidacy on record of sixteen years as a State Senator and four years as Lieutenant Governor, which he offers as guarantee of his future course. In this plank he includes four items that he favors, namely: woman's suffrage, industrial legislation, the State debt, and restriction of the appointive power, which he declares to be supplemental to and a part of his platform, making seventeen distinct planks in all.


