

### CLAYTON FOR ELDER

**Says His Friends Are For Elder And He Will Follow Them.**

Vidalia, La. Sept. 14.—Hon. J. W. Elder, candidate for Congress from this district, last night addressed the voters at this point in the interest of his candidacy. The audience was thoroughly attentive throughout his address, which was exceptionally well received, and it appears to be the consensus of opinion here that Mr. Elder will get the bulk of the vote of this parish, which cast only sixteen votes against Mr. Clayton in the first primary.

Several friends of Mr. Elder from the neighboring river parishes were present at the meeting which was called to order by Hon. John S. Boatner who after a few appropriate remarks, introduced Hon. J. E. Clayton as the chairman of the meeting. Mr. Clayton, in introducing Mr. Elder, spoke of the support given him in the recent primary and thanked his friends for their efforts in his behalf admitting that he felt some disappointment at not being successful in the congressional race.

Mr. Clayton expressed his purpose of supporting Mr. Elder and of throwing to Mr. Elder that of the support which he had received in the primary. He said: "Believing that a large majority of my personal and political friends favor the candidacy of Mr. Elder and in deference to their will and for other reasons satisfactory to myself, I have decided to cast my vote for Mr. Elder in the coming primary election and I now take pleasure in

introducing to you the Hon. J. W. Elder, candidate for congress, who will address you in interest of his candidacy."
