

Mr. Dalley offered the following ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit: ..

AN ORDINANCE

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry in the State of Louisiana, in lawful session duly assembled, that Sections Three (3) and Five (5) of an ordinance authorizing the issue of bonds of the First Sub-Road District in the Second Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, adopted June 10th, 1919 be amended so as to read as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained etc., that said bonds shall be of date the first of July, A. D. 1919, and shall begin to mature on the first day of July A. D. 1920, and shall become due and payable each year thereafter until and including the first day of July, A. D. 1959, and shall be in numbers and amounts as follows:

Fifty (50) bonds of the denomination of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), each, and dates of maturities, as follows, to-wit:

Know all men by these presents, that the First Sub-Road District of the Second Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, acting through its governing authority the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, for value received, hereby promises to pay to bearer on the day of A. D., 19--

One THOUSAND DOLLARS, lawful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent) per annum from the day of A. D., 19--

St. Landry, State of Louisiana, as representing an indebtedness incurred and to be incurred for the exclusive purpose of contracting for, acquiring, laying out and constructing a system of modern public roads within the limits of said Sub-Road District, the title to which shall vest in the Parish and public, and issued in accordance with the provisions of Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, adopted in 1898 and 1913, and Act No. 256 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1910, and laws amendatory thereof, after an election on the 18th day of March 1919, and on the question of such issue by the property taxpayers of said Sub-Road District, held, canvassed and the results declared and promulgated and registered, all according to law authorizing such issue; of which election there was no contest and can none now lawfully be made.

In testimony whereof, and by authority of ordinance of the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, the governing body of said Sub-Road District lawfully enacted on the day of A. D., 19-- and now recorded in Mortgage Office of the State of Louisiana, I. F. Octave Pavy, President of said Police Jury, has signed this bond along with J. J. Healey, Clerk of the Police Jury, likewise authorized, and sealed the same in accordance with law on this day of A. D., 19--

INTEREST COUPON. On the day of 19-- The First Sub-Road District of the Second Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, will pay to the bearer Dollars, at the office of the Treasurer of said Sub-Road District at Opelousas, Louisiana, or at the National Park Bank, in the City and State of New York, at the option of the holders or purchasers, being interest due that date on its Road Bond dated July 1, 1919, No. --

Each bond shall be signed by the President of the Police Jury and the Clerk, and the said officers are

hereby required to have written, printed or engraved on the reverse of said bonds the following certificate: THIS BOND SECURED BY A TAX Registered on this day of 19--

Secretary of State Which certificate, after the delays by-law have expired, and in accordance with Section 31 of Act 256 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, for the year 1910, shall be signed by the Secretary of State of the State of Louisiana, and have attached thereto the great seal of the State of Louisiana. The interest coupons attached to said bonds shall have printed or engraved thereon the fac-simile signatures of the President of the Police Jury and the Clerk thereof.

And when said bonds are this issued and signed and registered by the Secretary of State according to law, they shall again be taken into possession by the Clerk of the Police Jury who is hereby authorized to hold same until negotiated.

SECTION 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, shall annually at the same time other taxes are levied, in accordance with law, in addition to all other taxes now authorized by the constitution and laws, including any special tax, levy a tax above all said taxes sufficient to pay the principle and interest to the bonds herein directed, to be used as they may mature; which tax may be levied, if not already levied, and extended on the assessment rolls at any time prior to the final collection of taxes due for that particular year; and when collected shall be used, for the purpose of retiring maturing bonds and interest coupons as the same may become due.

Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance take effect on and after its promulgation.

EXHIBIT "A" ORDINANCE CREATING THE BAYOU COURTABLANC AND TECHE DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

Mr. G. W. Greig offered the following ordinance which was duly seconded by Mr. W. F. Brown.

AN ORDINANCE Of the police jury of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, creating the Bayou Courtablanc and Teche Drainage District of St. Landry Parish, State of Louisiana, and fixing the boundaries thereof, constituting said drainage district, a body corporate in law, and vesting it with power and authority incident thereto, to-wit: To divide the said drainage district into a Board of five (5) Commissioners, and fixing their domicile, providing for the qualification of said commissioners, the manner of their appointment, and fixing their term of office; providing for the first and subsequent meetings of the board and the election of officers, and fixing their compensation, authorizing and empowering the board to make and adopt by-laws, rules and regulations for its government and that of its officers; requiring the board to keep the proper books and accounts; and providing the method of procuring funds for the district.

SECTION 1. NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the said Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, now in regular session, duly assembled that all of the land and property situated within the following described boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the South Bank of the Bayou Courtablanc in the Town of Port Barre, La., where the public road leading from Port Barre to Opelousas leaves the said Bayou Courtablanc leading in a south easterly direction (said road being a continuation of the present gravel road from Opelousas to Port Barre) and following said Port Barre-Opelousas Public Road to the point where said road crosses the Bayou Teche; thence following the meanderings of the Bayou Teche in a southerly direction to a point one-half a mile due West of the range line between Town-
