Section 5—That notice of the elec-
tion containing the proposition herein
submitted to the property taxpayers
of said road district shall be pre-
pared and signed by the president of this
body, who shall cause the same to be
published in the official journal of the
Parish of St. Landry, by four
weekly insertions, the first of which
shall appear not less than thirty (30)
days before the date of said election.

Said notice shall be posted on
Monday, the 22nd day of February,
1920, at 2 o'clock p. m., the Police
Jury of the Parish of St. Landry
shall meet at the Police Jury room in
the City of Opelousas, La., and shall
then and there in public session pro-
ceed to open the ballot boxes exam-
ine and count the ballots in number
and amount, examine and canvass the
returns of said election, declare the
result thereof, and provide for the
promulgation of the same in accord-
ance with law.

this body be and he is hereby author-
ized to receive for said road bonds
of the Parish of St. Landry, the sum
of \$1,000.00, for the purpose of pay-
ing the same.

Mr. G. Greig offered the following
ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE
Whereas, an election was held in
the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana,
on the 27th day of May, 1919, in pur-
suance to an ordinance adopted by the
Police Jury on the 9th day of April, 1919,
notice of which was published according
to law; and

Whereas, the question submitted at
said election was to determine the
proposition:

PROPOSITION
To incur debt and to issue serial
negotiable coupon bonds of said First
Road District, Third Police Jury
Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La.,
to the amount of eighty-five thousand
dollars (\$85,000.00), to run for peri-
ods of from one (1) to forty (40)
years from the first day of July, A.
D. 1919, and to bear interest at the
rate of five (5) per cent per annum
from said date until paid; interest on
all said bonds to be paid semi-annual-
ly and said bonds or funds derived
thereof to be used and expended
under the direction and control
of the Police Jury of the Parish
of St. Landry, La., as the govern-
ing authority of said Fourth
Road District, Fourth Police
Jury Ward of the Parish of St.
Landry, La., for the exclusive
purpose of contracting for, ac-
quiring, laying out and construct-
ing a system of modern public
roads within the limits of said
road district, the title to which
shall vest in the parish and public.
A sufficient tax shall be levied
each year to meet the payment
of the bonds and interest as
same matures.

Section 2—That on Monday,
the second day of February, 1920, at
2 o'clock p. m., the Police Jury of
the Parish of St. Landry, La., shall
meet at the Police Jury room in the
City of Opelousas, La., and shall
then and there in public session pro-
ceed to open the ballot boxes, examine
and count the ballots in number and
amount, examine and canvass the re-
turns of said election, declare the
result thereof and provide for the
promulgation of same, in accordance
with law.

Section 3—That the ballot boxes,
the necessary blanks for tally sheets,
lists of voters, valuation of property
and compiled statement of the
voters in number and amount and
other necessary election parapher-
nalia shall be provided for by the
clerk of the Police Jury, and he shall
cause to be printed ballots for use
in said election, in the following form
to-wit:

To incur debt and to issue
serial negotiable coupon
bonds of said Fourth Road
District, Fourth Police Jury
Ward of the Parish of St.
Landry, La., to the amount
of seventy-five thousand
dollars (\$75,000.00), to run
for periods of from one (1)
to thirty (30) years, and to
bear interest at the rate
of five per cent (5) per an-
num from said date until
paid; interest on all said
bonds to be paid semi-annual-
ly and said bonds or funds
derived from the sale there-
of to be used and expended
under the direction and
control of the Police
Jury of the Parish of St. Landry,
La., as the governing
authority of said Fourth

on the first day of July, 1919, and
which shall bear interest at the rate
of five per cent (5) per annum, pay-
able semi-annually from date, with
interest coupons attached to each
bond; and said bonds shall not be
sold for less than par.

Section 2—That the proceeds of
said bond issue, when negotiated,
shall be deposited in the treasury of
said parish, and there shall be and re-
main as a trust fund to be used only
for the purpose for which the same
were raised as set forth in the pre-
amble hereof.

Section 3—That said bonds shall
be of date the first day of July, A. D.
1919, and shall begin to mature on
the first day of July, A. D. 1920, and
shall become due and payable each
year thereafter until and including
the first day of July, A. D. 1959, and
shall be in numbers and amounts as

as same may mature. The said prin-
cipal and interest on this bond being

at the option of the holder.

This bond is one of a series of eighty-
five bonds of the denomination of
\$1,000.00 each, and numbered from
one (1) to eighty-five (85), issued
by the Police Jury of the Parish of St.
Landry, La., for and on behalf of the
First Road District, Third Police Jury
Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La.,
as representing an indebtedness in-
curred for the exclusive purpose of
constructing roads and bridges in said
road district, and issued in accord-
ance with the provisions of the con-
stitution and laws of the State of
Louisiana, in pursuance to an elec-
tion held in said road district on Tues-
day, May 27, 1919, the result of
which was duly canvassed, declared,
promulgated and registered accord-
ing to law, of which said election
there was no contest and none can
now be lawfully made.

And it is hereby certified and re-
cited that all acts, conditions and
things required to be done precedent
to and in the issuance of said bonds
have been properly done, have hap-
pened and have been performed in
regular form and duly as required by
law, and that said indebtedness does
not exceed any statutory or constitu-
tional limitations.

Each bond shall be signed by the
president of the Police Jury and the
clerk thereof, and said officers are
hereby required to have written, printed
or engraved on the reverse of said
bonds the following certificate:

"This bond secured by a tax. Reg-
istered on the day of
., 19

"Secretary of State"

Which certificate after the delays
provided by law have expired and in
accordance with Section 31 of Act
256 of the General Assembly of the
State of Louisiana for the year 1910,
and the laws amendatory thereof, shall
be signed by the Secretary of State
of the State of Louisiana and have at-
tached thereto the great seal of the
State of Louisiana. The interest cou-
pons attached to said bonds shall have
printed or engraved thereon the fac-
simile signatures of the president and
clerk of the Police Jury.

And when said bonds are thus is-
sued and registered by the Secretary
of State according to law, they shall
again be taken into possession by the
clerk of the Police Jury and by him
held until negotiated.

Section 4—That when said bonds
have been signed, issued, registered
and returned to the clerk of the Pol-
ice Jury, they shall be ready for ne-
gotiating and the president of the Pol-
ice Jury is hereby authorized fully
for that purpose.

Section 5—That the Police Jury
of the Parish of St. Landry, La., shall
levy on all taxable property in said
road district in accordance with law,
at the same time as other taxes are
levied, in addition to all other taxes
now authorized by the constitution
and laws including any special tax,
a tax above all said taxes sufficient to
pay the interest and principal of the
bonds herein directed to be issued as
the same may mature; which tax may
be levied and extended on the assess-
ment rolls at any time prior to the
final collection of taxes due for that
particular year; and when collected,
shall be used for no other purpose
than that of retiring maturing bonds
and coupons.

Section 6—That the clerk of the
Police Jury shall cause the original of
this ordinance to be recorded in the
mortgage records of the Parish of St.
Landry, and also published in the
Star-Progress, the official journal of
the Parish of St. Landry, according
to law.

Section 7—Be it further ordained,
etc., that this ordinance take effect
from and after its promulgation.

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE POLICE JURY

Opelousas, La., Dec. 1, 1919.

The Police Jury met in regular ses-
sion this first day of December, 1919,
with the following members present:

Dr. F. O. Pavy, president, presid-
ing; Messrs. St. Cyr, Larcade, Mills,
Rushing, Martin, Sylvestre, Dejean,
McCoy, Catlett, Cummings.

Motion by Mr. St. Cyr—
Resolved, first, that the president
of this body be and he is hereby di-
rected and instructed to appoint from
among the members of this body a
committee of three to advertise for
sealed bids from the banks located in
this parish to act as fiscal agent of
this parish for the two years begin-
ning on the first day of February,
1920; and

Second, that all bidders must make
their bids in conformity with the
provisions of Act No. 205 of 1912 of the
Acts of the General Assembly of the
State of Louisiana, and be required
to state separately and distinctly,
first, what rate of interest they are
willing to allow to the parish for such
sums as it may have on deposit during
the existence of the contract; and

secondly, what rate of interest they
propose to charge the parish for such
loans or advances as may be required
to meet its annual budget appropri-
ations in anticipation and in advance
of the collection of its annual reve-
nues; and

Third, that all bids must be ad-
dressed to the "Police Jury of the
Parish of St. Landry," and must have
highly written or typewritten on the
outside of the envelope and on the
same side as the address, the words
"Fiscal Agency Bid," and that all bids
must be delivered at Opelousas, La.,
to the clerk of the Police Jury, or
some member of this committee on or
before twelve o'clock, noon, on Mon-
day, January 5, 1920 at which time
they will be opened and the fiscal
agent designated and the amount of
the bond fixed by this body.

LICENSE ORDINANCE
An ordinance for the levying and col-
lecting of Parish Licenses for the
year 1920.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury
of the Parish of St. Landry, in regu-
lar session convened:

Section 1—That the license laws
of the State of Louisiana now in force
shall, in so far as applicable, be the
license laws of the Parish of St. Landry
for the year 1920, except as here-
inafter modified and changed.
