Resolution of the School Board.

ART. 1. RESOLVED, That a Central High School be and is hereby established in the town of Opelousas, in the Public School House, provided by the citizens and taxpayers of said town of Opelousas for that purpose; said School House having been placed under the exclusive jurisdiction and control of the Parish School Board, by a resolution of the B. of P. of the T. of O.

ART. 2. Said School shall be designated as The St. Landry High School, and shall be open, free of charge, to the boys and girls of the entire Parish of St. Landry who are sufficiently advanced in their studies to enter the lowest class in said school.

ART. 3. A committee consisting of three qualified persons (not necessarily members of the School Board) shall be appointed by the President of this Body, whose duty it shall be to examine applicants for admission to the High School and recommend for advancement such as may be found properly qualified.

ART. 4. A sufficient amount of money shall be appropriated annually out of the General School Fund to equip and maintain said High School.

ART. 5. Pupils having passed through the required High School course, shall be awarded Diplomas or Certificates of Graduation, signed by the Principal of the High School, the President of the School Board and the Parish Superintendent.

ART. 6. The sum of eight hundred and sixty dollars is hereby appropriated out of the current funds for the employment of teachers for the first term, which shall begin Jan. 2nd, 1894, and last six months.

ART. 7. The sum of sixty dollars is hereby appropriated for the employment of a Janitor for six months, whose duty it shall be to keep the school house and grounds clean and orderly, and perform such other services connected with the School as the Principal may direct.

ART. 8. The sum of \$200 is hereby appropriated to aid in purchasing the necessary School Furniture and Fixtures for said High School.
