AN ORDINANCE.

AN ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained, That canals for irrigation, navigation or transportation purposes be granted a "right of way" to cross the public roads, provided, that the crossings and approaches thereto be built, constructed and maintained at the expense of the said canal, irrigation or transportation companies.

Said crossings and approaches thereto to be under the supervision of such road overseers as may be from time to time appointed by the Police Jury.

AN ORDINANCE

RELATIVE TO ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of St. Landity in special session convened. That the numbers and limits or boundaries of the election precincts of the parish remain as fixed by resolution of the Police Jury adopted on the 27th day of August, 1895, except as hereinafter provided.
