### The Election.

The primary election Tuesday resulted in the nomination of Judge Newton C. Blanchard by a majority of (estimated) 12000.

General Jastremski accepted his defeat gracefully, and telegraphed his congratulations to his successful opponent.

St. Landry parish was carried by Gen. Jastremski by 1213 majority. In parochial matters, Swords was elected over his two opponents, and is the nominee for Sheriff.

A second race for Clerk is necessary, and the contest is between H. E. Estorge and Yves Andrepont.

Dr. Z. T. Young and Dr. Boudreau run again for Coroner.

Dossmann and Stagg will make a second race for Assessor.

J. J. Bailey and Dudley L. Guilbeau go in on the first ballot for Representatives. A second race for that office will be run between Oge, Mixer, Sandoz and Mouton.

Dossmann is elected over Perrault for State Committeeman.

E. S. Kerr and Judge Simon were elected Magistrates for first ward on first ballot, J. E. Deballon, A. Hollier and A. St. Cyr running in the second primary for constables same ward.
