CHARTER

OF THE

"HOME INDUSTRIAL SOCIETY."

STATE OF LOUISIANA, Parish of St. Landry.

Personally appeared Philip Lewis, Rufus Brown, Ebb, Wikoff, Dennis Randle, Abe Brown, Lias Hinton, Columbus Hodges and Oneal Wikoff, all residents of the above Parish and State, who declared unto me, Notary, in the presence of the two undersigned competent witnesses, that, desiring to avail themselves of the provisions of the laws of this State relating to the formation of corporations for religious and charitable purposes and to acquire and enjoy the rights, privileges and powers of a body corporate and politic in law, they do hereby form themselves into such a corporation and body politic and the name of said corporation for the purposes hereinafter specifically set forth.

ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation and association shall be

"Home Industrial Society."

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes of this corporation and association are to buy and own land upon which to erect and maintain a hotel, such other buildings as may be necessary for the good or needs of this corporation or association.

ARTICLE III.

Under the above entitled name and for the purposes above expressed, the said corporation shall have the power and authority to make, have and use a common seal, with such device and description as they shall deem proper, and by the name, style and title provided and declared in and to be capable in law to sue and be sued, and shall be empowered to make rules, by-laws and ordinances and do everything needful for their good government and support and shall be elected at the same time, have and hold all manner of lands, tenements, rents and inheritments, and any sum of money, and any manner of goods and chattels given unto it, or acquired by it in any manner.

ARTICLE IV.

The domicile of the association and corporation shall be and is hereby fixed at Opelousas, La.

ARTICLE V.

The officers of this corporation and association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually by a two-thirds vote of a quorum, fifteen to constitute a quorum, officers included, and who shall serve until their successors shall be elected and qualified; and the said officers, together with four others who shall be elected at the same time, shall constitute the Board of Directors of this association, the majority of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The said officers shall have the power and authority which usually belongs to their respective positions, until the election above provided for, which shall be in August. Philip Lewis shall be President; Rufus Brown shall be Vice-President; Dennis Randle shall be Treasurer; Ebb, Wikoff shall be Secretary, and Abe Brown, Lias Hinton, Columbus Hodges and Oneal Wikoff, shall be said officers, constitute the Board of Directors of this association, as above provided.

ARTICLE VI.

The President, and in his absence, the Treasurer, is hereby designated as the officer upon whom citations may be served.

ARTICLE VII.

This corporation and association shall exist and continue in force for a term of ninety-nine years, unless sooner dissolved by a three-fifths vote of the entire attending membership borne upon its association of business. The said officers called for that purpose, after fifteen days' notice, said notice to be public.

ARTICLE VIII.

The Board of Directors may adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of this corporation and association as they may deem proper, subject to the approval of the members.

ARTICLE IX.

This corporation hereby expressly and specially sets forth this rule that shall in no manner be changed, to-wit: that the action of this corporation or association shall be for aiding and assisting one another while sick or suffering from some accident, provided, however, that the sickness or accident is not brought on by their own vicious or intemperate habits; and that in no instance shall any rule, regulation or ordinance be passed so as to allow the funds of this corporation or association to be used for any other purpose than that for which this corporation or association was formed, to-wit: the upbuilding morally and socially of its members and extending charity to the brotherhood. In testimony hereof, the said parties have hereunto fixed their signatures, together with me, their Notary and subscribing witnesses, on this tenth day of June, 1904.
