Mr. Lawler, desiring to offer ordinances relative to sewerage and paving, of which he had previously given notice, requested that Mr. Lewis take the chair. Whereupon Mr. Lawler offered the following ordinances, and the same, after having been read section by section, was duly seconded by Mr. Lewis and unanimously carried.

AN ORDINANCE

Calling an election for the purpose of taking the sense of the property taxpayers of the city of Opelousas, La., qualified to vote on the question of issuing bonds to the amount of thirty thousand (\$30,000) dollars, for the purpose of constructing a system of sewerage for the city of Opelousas, La., said bonds to run for a period of forty years and to bear interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, payable annually on the first day of July of each year at the office of the Treasurer of said city of Opelousas; and for the further purpose of levying and assessing a special tax of two and one-half mills per annum on all taxable property located in said city for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the bonds herein provided for; and for the purpose of designating the polling place to be used, and authorizing the Mayor to issue his proclamation accordingly.

Whereas, It is necessary in the opinion of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., that a special election be held to take the sense of the property taxpayers of this city, qualified to vote, on the propositions set forth; therefore:

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., in regular session convened, that a special election be held in the city of Opelousas, La., on the 14th day of August, 1906, for the purpose of taking the sense of the property taxpayers of said city, qualified to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, on the question of incurring debt, issuing negotiable bonds to the amount of thirty thousand (\$30,000) dollars, and for the further purpose of levying and assessing a special tax of two and one-half mills per annum, on all the taxable property located in said city for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of the bonds herein provided for; and for the purpose of designating the polling place to be used, and authorizing the Mayor to issue his proclamation accordingly.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the election shall be held from 7 o'clock in the forenoon to 5 o'clock in the afternoon, and that the polling place shall be located as follows:

At the Mayor's Office in the Parish Courthouse, in the city of Opelousas, corner of Court and Landry streets.

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Charter of the City of Opelousas, La., and in compliance with the ordinance passed at the regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of said city on the 3d day of July, 1906, I, Benjamin A. Littell, Mayor of the City of Opelousas, La., do issue this my proclamation calling an election to be held in the city of Opelousas, La., on Tuesday, the 14th day of August, 1906, for the purpose of taking the sense of the property taxpayers of the City of Opelousas, La., qualified to vote under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, on the question of incurring debt, issuing negotiable bonds to the amount of thirty thousand dollars, for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of the bonds referred to in said ordinance.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La., in regular session convened, that a special election be held in the city of Opelousas, La., on the 14th day of August, 1906, for the purpose of taking the sense of the property taxpayers of said city, qualified to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, on the question of incurring debt, issuing negotiable bonds to the amount of thirty thousand (\$30,000) dollars, and for the further purpose of levying and assessing a special tax of two and one-half mills per annum, on all the taxable property located in said city for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of the bonds herein provided for; and for the purpose of designating the polling place to be used, and authorizing the Mayor to issue his proclamation accordingly.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the election shall be held from 7 o'clock in the forenoon to 5 o'clock in the afternoon, and that the polling place shall be located as follows:
