A bulletin issued by the United States Department of Agriculture from the office of Public Roads shows that in 1904 there were 121,409 miles of public oad the State of Texas. Of this mileage, 1,909 miles were surfaced with gravel 167 miles with stone, and 52 miles with shell,making in all 2,128 miles of improved road. It will be seen from these figures that 1.7 per cent of the roads have been improved. 
