JIM BAILEY MAKES STRONG IMPRESSION IN CALCASIEU.

St. Landry Man is Confident of Success--"Will Make the State a Splendid Officer if Elected," Says Press.

Hon. James J. Bailey made a canvass of Calcasieu parish last week, and was everywhere received cordially and assured support. The St. Landry man stands well in our neighboring parish, and reports from there are that he will carry it a-whooping.

The Lake Charles Press, speaking of his visit there, says: "Of all of the candidates now in Calcasieu parish none are making a harder campaign than Hon. James J. Bailey of St. Landry, who is making the race for lieutenant governor. Mr. Bailey will arrive in the city to-night with Lieutenant Governor Sanders. He has been making a complete canvass of Calcasieu and hopes for an opportunity to make a speech in Lake Charles during the next few days.

"I am almost sure to carry Calcasieu by a large vote," said Mr. Bailey to a Daily Press representative at Welsh last night, "because the people of this section of the state will remember the reforms I have stood for and fought ever since I was honored by my home parish in being sent to the legislature. I have every assurance that I will carry Calcasieu by a good vote, and I feel just as confident of my election as I do that I am living and breathing at this moment."

"Mr. Bailey has a way of making friends wherever he goes. He is a gentleman of strong personality, convincing in his arguments, honest and fair in his opinions and one who will make the state a splendid officer if elected."

OBERLIN CASE GOES UP.

Calcasieu District Court Sustains Exception Of No Jurisdiction.

The District Court of Calcasieu parish, Judge Miller presiding, rendered a decision in the case of Zenop Darbonne against the village of Oberlin, situated in Calcasieu parish, on the Calcasieu-St. Landry parish line. The suit contested the result of the recent prohibition election in that village.

The exceptions were that under the law passed by the legislature in 1902 the people of Oberlin had no right to grant license for liquor and also that the district court had no jurisdiction in the case. The court sustained the latter exception. Notice of appeal to the supreme court was immediately given by attorneys for the plaintiff.
