

### INVADING STATE CAPITAL.

Prohibition Campaign Inaugurated in East Baton Rouge Parish by W. C. T. U'S.

Baton Rouge, April 16.—It has been decided to inaugurate a prohibition campaign in Baton Rouge. At a meeting of the Women's Home Protective League, the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the ministers of the city it was decided to inaugurate an active prohibition campaign immediately after the four lectures that are to be delivered in this city next week by Rev. E. O. Taylor, Boston, Mass., who is to speak on the scientific effects of whiskey.

A petition calling for an election will first be presented to the police jury, and then it is planned to bring a number of prominent prohibition speakers to Baton Rouge.

Several have already spoken here, including Assistant Attorney General Trickett, of Kansas.

Rev. E. O. Taylor is a noted student of the scientific aspects of the liquor problem and will deliver a course of four lectures in this city, beginning Sunday night, at the First Methodist Church, and continuing on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at Garig Hall. This arrangement was made at a meeting of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, the Home Protective League, and the various Protestant ministers. Dr. Taylor has spent ten winters lecturing in the South and has been prominently identified with the great prohibition movement of the South from the beginning. At the conclusion of the lectures the various temperance organizations of the city expect to organize for an active fight for prohibition in this city.

### WANT KENTUCKIANS HERE.

Effort Being Made to Get Victims of Night Riders to Locate in Louisiana.

Night Riders, a band of lawless men, have desolated the tobacco fields of Kentucky, and the tobacco farmers are looking for locations where they can pursue their labors in peace.

Louisiana is well-known as possessing soil particularly adapted to the culture of tobacco, although the industry has received very little attention here, except in St. James parish, where the celebrated Perique tobacco is cultivated and furnished to the world as the only one of its kind. We believe it has been stated that the Perique could be grown in almost every section of Louisiana; but be that as it may, it is an undisputed fact that Louisiana can grow as good a quality of tobacco as Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky and Pennsylvania.

The New Orleans Progressive League has interested itself in the case of the Kentucky victims of the

night-riders, and is writing to secretaries of progressive leagues as follows:

"It has recently been called to the attention of the Progressive Union at New Orleans, that a large number of expert tobacco growers of Kentucky, whose business has been destroyed through the operations of the night riders might be brought to Louisiana and engage in the business of tobacco growing in this State.

"I am informed by Col. Charles Schuler, State Commissioner of Agriculture & Immigration, that the State of Louisiana has hundreds of thousands of acres of land susceptible to the growing of tobacco and as Col. Schuler says, all we need is men experienced in the growing and curing, to make it profitable in this State. Col. Schuler offers to assist the movement in every way possible and has sent me a copy of the State Experiment Station's Bulletin giving result of experiments made with tobacco growing and curing at the North Louisiana Station.

"As North Louisiana is the field for this enterprise, I deem it proper that the New Orleans Progressive Union should lay this matter before the business organizations of that section of the State with the offer to assist North Louisiana in the development of this proposition. Anything which tends to enrich the State must inevitably enrich New Orleans and I trust that you may call upon us if you find that we may be of use.




