Opelousas, La., Jan. 24, 1911. To the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas.

Gentlemen: Being informed by you that you had regularly advertised for bids from banks to act as your fiscal agent under the provisions of Act No. 316 of the Acts of the General Assembly of this State for the year 1910, and that you had received no bid in pursuance to said advertisement, and being further informed that it was imperative that you should be able to borrow money on anticipation of the revenues of the current year in order to enable you to properly carry on the business of the municipality, and that you were desirous that we should make you a proposition to advance you the required funds;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the premises, we propose to advance you the funds necessary to meet your budget appropriations, for the year 1911, provided they do not exceed your anticipated revenues, at the rate of six per cent per annum, provided all municipal funds are deposited in this bank until all of said loans are fully repaid and liquidated and provided that all revenues of the City for the year 1911 be pledged to secure the repayment of said loans or advances. It is even understood that any funds which the City might have on deposit would not bear interest.

This proposition if accepted shall be embodied in a formal contract satisfactory to both parties.
