**These Are Men Who Count.**

A Monday's Baton Rouge dispatch to the Times-Democrat says:

F. S. Dougherty, a landowner of the city, has made the offer of a cite for factory purposes of 300 acres each on the line of the Yazoo and Mississippi Valley Railway, the Baton Rouge, Hammond and Eastern Railway, and Navigation Company. He will also give a bonus of \$100 in cash to

the factory first taking the choice of one of these locations and guaranteeing to employ as many as twenty-five laborers in its operation. The only qualifications required are that the concern will demonstrate its ability to erect a plant and use the natural products of this section in its business.

**Pigs During Winter.**

Have you ever observed how subject your pigs are to cold? How they shiver and seek shelter in fence corners against the cold winds of winter? And do you know that the food that ought to go to make pigs grow, must in such cases be used to produce bodily heat for the little fellows? No farmer who is engaged in hog-raising can afford to leave litters of young pigs exposed to the rigors of our wintery days, particularly when it rains and the wind blows chill from the north.

It is easy and costs little to provide clean shelter for the hogs. If the hog-house has no floor, raise the dirt floor by filling in, and supply clean bedding. Good shelter and clean bedding pay; they pay by the saving on the feed bill; they pay by the quicker growth in the weight of the animals.—Dept. Agricultural Extension, Louisiana State University.

**Hog Cholera Cure.**

If you will give five drops of crude carbolic acid to each hog it will prevent the rest of the bunch from catching the disease. This is a remedy that has been used by our family with good results. We have never had a sick hog after giving acid mixed with food. We don't let them have anything else until they eat up the feed with the acid in it. The hogs will not eat it very readily. The same remedy will answer for chickens with cholera, only give them but two drops per chicken.—W. H. Burke, Clarks-ville, Texas.

**Crop Prospects in Lafayette.**
