**ST. LANDRY AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL AND ITS PURPOSES.**

The St. Landry Agricultural High School, popularly known as the Grand Prairie Agricultural High School, was established at the beginning of the last school term. During the 1910 session of the General Assembly \$25,000 per annum, for the years 1910-11, was appropriated in aid of the Agricultural Departments in Louisiana schools and the establishment of this school was made possible by this appropriation, aided by the Parish School Board, Police Jury and the progressive citizens of this community. There are seventeen of these schools in operation in the State this year.

Grand Prairie, the seat of this Agricultural School and Demonstration Farm, is in the west central portion of St. Landry, fourteen miles from Opelousas and eight miles from Washington. This section of Louisiana is noted for its healthfulness and beauty. No school could have better natural surroundings, situated as it is on a broad, fertile prairie and settled by a class of as energetic and progressive farmers as can be found in the State. There is little to draw the pupil from the work for which he comes and the social and religious influences within and surrounding the school are as good as can be found in any section of Louisiana. Grand Prairie affords superior church advantages and such other influences as will aid the management of the school in building up strong and vigorous characters, characters fraught with positive convictions of right and duty to themselves and their country.

**PURPOSE OF SCHOOL.**

The purpose of this school is to teach scientific and practical agriculture; to educate and train the boys and girls of the Parish for teachers in the public schools of the State; to prepare those who wish to pursue a course in higher schools and universities and to give a good, practical education to those who cannot attend such institutions.

**THE FARM.**

The Demonstration Farm, presented to the State by Mr. Ozeme Fontenot, consists of ten acres of the most fertile soil in the Prairie. This farm is situated right at the school building and is under the direct control of an experienced, practical farmer who is a graduate of one of the most prominent agricultural colleges of the South. He will take pleasure at all times in explaining anything in connection with the work to the farmers of the Parish or any one who may be interested.

The entire ten acres of land is under fence and upon it such demonstrations will be made as will advance scientific horticulture and agriculture. Letters of information to farmers of the parish concerning any phase of agriculture will be sent upon request. Bulletins issued by the Department of Agriculture at Washington and the various experimental stations of the South are received by this school and will be kept on file in the Agricultural Hall. The farmers of the Parish may have access to the bulletins at any time.
