The New Game Law Can Be Seen At My Shop

Notice to Taxpayers.

Opelousas, La., Oct. 6, 1911. The books are now open for the payment of all taxes and licenses. Taxes on movable property will be delinquent on Nov. 1st, 1911. Taxes on real estate will be delinquent on Dec. 1st, 1911. The per capita tax for public roads will be strictly enforced and is due from this date. Vehicle licenses are now due and will be diligently enforced. Poll taxes are now due and must be paid before Dec. 31st, 1911, or you can't vote. Two per cent per month will be charged on all delinquents. Don't delay as the office is now open. Avoid the rush.
