Opelousas, La., Dec. 27, 1911. To the Honorable Members of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La.  
 Gentlemen: You are hereby notified that there will be a meeting of your Honorable Board this Wednesday, Dec. 27th, 1911, at 4:00 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of passing on the Liquor License Ordinance, and to act on any matter relative to same; for the further purpose of passing on application for saloons; for the further purpose of considering the application of Mr. Andrepont for the purpose of purchasing of 40 or 50 of 24 inch tiles; and for the further purpose of providing some means for securing some fuel oil for the Power Plant.

 Opelousas, La., Dec. 27, 1911. The Board of Aldermen met pursuant to the above call. Present: M. Halphen, Mayor, presiding; Aldermen Blacksher, Danel, Dietlein, Loeb and Larcade.

All the members being present the meeting was called to order. Motion by Mr. Loeb—

That class "C" of Section 1 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1911, be made to read as follows:

"When the gross annual receipts are less than forty thousand dollars, the annual license shall be six hundred dollars; provided that no license under this ordinance shall be issued for less than six hundred dollars, except as is provided for by existing State laws relative to dealers in malt and vinous liquors. Sec-  
 onded by Mr. Danel.

Mr. Blacksher offers as a substitute, that class "C" of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 16 of 1911, be made to read \$1000.00 instead of \$600.00.

Motion lost for want of a second.

Vote on original motion of Mr. Loeb:

Motion carried.

Mr. Dietlein was absent when the above vote was taken.

**AN ORDINANCE**  
 No. 16 of 1911.

Providing for the levy of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, firms or corporations conducting the business of retail liquor dealers within the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas, Louisiana, for the year 1912, grading same, and providing penalties for the violation hereof.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La., That there shall be and there is hereby levied upon all persons, firms, corporations or associations of persons, engaged in the business of retail liquor dealers, for the year 1912, the following license, to-wit:

Class "A." When the gross annual receipts of said business shall be One Hundred Thousand Dollars or over Seventy-five Thousand Dollars the annual license shall be Three Thousand Dollars.

Class "B." When the gross annual receipts are less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars and less than Forty Thousand Dollars, the annual license shall be Two Thousand Dollars.

Class "C." When the gross annual receipts are less than Forty Thousand Dollars, the annual license shall be six hundred dollars. Provided that no license under this ordinance shall be issued for less than six hundred dollars, except as is provided for by existing State laws relative to dealers in malt and vinous liquors.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That for good and sufficient reasons, this ordinance shall take effect from and after its adoption.
