State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Landry, Be it known, that on this twenty-seventh (27th) day of the month of March...

Article I. The name and style of this corporation is hereby declared to be the Lawtell Gin Company, Limited, and it shall have and enjoy succession...

Article III. The object and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be carried on by it are hereby declared to be as follows...

Article IV. The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at the sum of twenty thousand dollars, divided into two thousand shares...

Article V. All the corporate power of this corporation shall be vested in a board of directors, to be composed of five stockholders...

Article VI. The capital stock of this corporation may be increased at any time in accordance with the laws of the State...

Article VII. No stockholder of this corporation shall be held liable for any of the debts, indebtedness, or contracts thereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the corporation on the shares owned by him...

The following ordinance was read: ORDINANCE NO. 22. An ordinance requiring all dogs in the Town of Melville, La., to be licensed and tagged. Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, That all dogs in the town of Melville, La., shall be licensed and wear a suitable tag for which be charged one dollar (\$1.00) for all he dogs and two dollars (\$2.00) for all she dogs. Sec. 2. Be it further ordained that all dogs found on the streets of said town which has not been licensed and wearing the proper tag the same shall be killed by the Marshal or by order of the Mayor.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, That at any time any she dog running the streets of said town shall be declared a nuisance, the owner shall be notified, if a resident of said town of Melville, and if after notification such she dog is not shut up the same shall be killed by the Marshal or by order of the Mayor, even if said she dog has been licensed and wearing a proper tag. Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed, and that this ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage. Thus done and passed in regular session convened on this 5th day of March, 1912, A. D. L. J. WILLIAMS, Mayor.

The following ordinance was read: ORDINANCE NO. 23. An ordinance for the levying and collecting of town licenses. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen in regular session convened: Sec. 1. That the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force shall in so far as applicable be the license ordinance of the town of Melville, La. Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage. Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed. Thus done and passed in regular session convened on this 5th day of March, 1912, A. D. L. J. WILLIAMS, Mayor. Attest: E. J. LeBLANC, Clerk.
