 That the report of committee appointed to examine the books of the Parish Treasurer, be received and accepted, and ordered spread upon the minutes;  
 Resolved further, that Mr. Robt. Lafleur, be and he is hereby granted his final quietus. Motion carried.  
 Mr. St. Cyr in the Chair.  
 On motion of Mr. J. E. Dailey, duly seconded and carried.  
 The following rules of order were adopted, to-wit:  
 Rules of Order.  
 1. The President of the Police Jury shall take his seat at the appointed hour and immediately call the Police Jury to order.  
 2. He shall preserve decorum and order, speak to points of order in preference to other members and decide all questions of order subject, however, to an appeal to the Jury.  
 3. He shall appoint all committees unless otherwise provided by special resolution or ordinance.  
 4. All members shall remain seated except when about to speak in debate or to make a motion, or otherwise to address the President, and in that event the member shall arise and address himself respectfully to "Mr. President." Should two or more members arise to address the President at the same time, he shall recognize one of them, when the others shall immediately resume their seats.  
 5. No member shall speak to any question more than once until every member desiring to speak shall have done so.  
 6. Every member who shall be present, including the President, when a question is put, shall vote on one side or the other, unless the Jury for special reasons shall excuse him.  
 7. When a resolution is offered it shall be in writing, and shall be read aloud by the Clerk, or some member of the Jury, and then be ready for debate.  
 8. No member shall speak more than twice to any question without the special permission of the President.  
 9. Whenever the President shall desire to speak, he shall call some member to the Chair to pre-
