

The following license ordinance was offered by Mr. Dailey, seconded by Mr. Guillory: LICENSE ORDINANCE.

An ordinance for the levying and collecting of Parish Licenses for the year 1913.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry in regular session convened:

Section 1. That the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force shall in so far as applicable be the license ordinance of the Parish of St. Landry for the year 1913, except as hereinafter modified and changed:

Section 2. That the annual license for peddlers and hawkers in one and two horse vehicles shall be \$15.00 and \$20.00 respectively:

Section 3. That the amount to be paid as an annual license tax by retail dealers in distilled, alcoholic and malt liquors shall be graded as follows:

First Class: When the gross annual sales shall be \$30,000.00 or more, the license shall be \$2,500.00;

Second Class: When the gross annual sales shall be less than \$30,000.00 and not more than \$20,000.00, the license shall be \$2,000.00;

Third Class: When the gross annual sales shall be less than \$20,000.00 and not more than \$10,000.00, the license shall be \$1,500.00;

Fourth Class: When the gross annual sales shall be \$10,000.00 or less, the license shall be \$600.00;

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect on and after January 1st, 1913.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Guillory, seconded by Mr. Dailey, and upon being duly read was adopted unanimously, to-wit:

ANNUAL TAX ORDINANCE. Whereas, by resolution adopted on October 7th, 1912, this body framed a budget of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00), as an estimate exhibiting the various items of expenditure that the parish of St. Landry would require for the year of 1913, and Whereas, said budget has been published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official newspaper of this parish, for the full term of thirty (30) days as the law directs, and

Whereas, an ad valorem tax of (9) mills on the dollar of the taxable property of this parish will be required in addition to the revenues to be derived under the license ordinance adopted to meet said budget:

Now therefore, be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, that a tax of nine (9) mills on the dollar be levied on all taxable property situated within this parish on which the State levies a tax to meet said budget of expenditures for the year 1913.

AN ORDINANCE Ordering a special election throughout the limits of the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Police Jury Wards, respectively, of St. Landry Parish, Louisiana, constituting the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Public Road Districts thereof, to take the sense of the property tax payers of said Wards and Road Districts as to whether a special tax of three mills on the dollar per annum shall be levied on all taxable property therein, for five years beginning with the year 1913, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the public roads and bridges in said Wards and Road Districts, in lieu of the vehicle tax now levied for those purposes, but not in lieu of the per capita tax levied under existing ordinances, which per capita tax is to remain in full force and effect.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry in regular session convened:

Section 1. That a special election be held throughout the limits of the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Police Jury Wards respectively, which constitute the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Public Road Districts of this parish, on Tuesday, the 11th day of February, 1913, at which election shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said Wards and Road Districts who are entitled to vote under the Constitution and laws of this State, the question of whether or not a special tax of three mills on the dollar per annum shall be levied on all taxable property in said Wards and Road Districts for the period of five years beginning with the year 1913, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the public roads and bridges in said Wards and Road Districts, in lieu of the vehicle tax now levied for those purposes, but not in lieu of the per capita tax levied under existing ordinances, which per capita tax is to remain in full force and effect.

Section 2. That said special election shall be held under the General Election laws of this State at the polling places established by law in said Wards and Road Districts respectively, and the ballots to be used at said election shall be printed in the form prescribed by the general election laws of this State and shall have printed thereon:

FOR a special tax of three mills on the dollar per annum for five years beginning with the year 1913, to be levied on all the taxable property in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Police Jury Wards, respectively, constituting the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Public Road Districts of the Parish of St. Landry, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the public roads and bridges in said Wards and Road Districts, in lieu of the vehicle taxes now levied

for those purposes, but not in lieu of the per capita tax levied under existing ordinances, which per capita tax is to remain in full force and effect.

AGAINST a special tax of three mills on the dollar per annum for five years beginning with the year 1913, to be levied on all the taxable property in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Police Jury Wards, respectively, constituting the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Public Road Districts of the Parish of St. Landry, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the public roads and bridges in said Wards and Road Districts, in lieu of the vehicle taxes now levied for those purposes, but not in lieu of the per capita tax levied under existing ordinances, which per capita tax is to remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. That the Board of Supervisors of Elections of this parish be and they are hereby requested and directed to appoint three commissioners and a clerk of election for each polling place of said Wards and Road Districts respectively, to give due notice of said appointment and of the time and place of holding said election, and to make returns of said election to the President of the Police Jury who shall announce and promulgate the result according to law

Section 4. That said Board of Supervisors of Elections shall have printed in accordance with the general election laws of this State and with this ordinance, the requisite number of ballots, tally sheets, lists of voters and compiled statements, which shall be delivered to the Sheriff to be transmitted with the ballot boxes to the commissioners of election.

Section 5. That each voter voting at said election shall endorse on his ballot his signature and the aggregate amount of assessed valuation of property assessed to him in said Wards and Road Districts

Section 6. That the commissioners of election at each polling place shall receive the ballots of all property tax payers of said Wards and Road Districts respectively, entitled to vote at their respective polls under the Constitution and laws of this State, and the polls shall have been closed shall count said ballots and make returns of the votes cast at said election both in number and in amount of the assessed value of property of those who voted for said tax, and of those who voted against the same, said returns shall be made in duplicate, and one set shall be delivered to the President of the Police Jury and the other to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Election, or mailed to them respectively at Opelousas, La.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall be published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official journal of this parish, for the full period of thirty days previous to the date fixed for holding said election, and that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.
