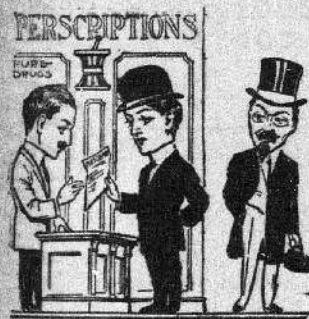

**Port Barre Proceedings.**

A special meeting of the council of the village of Port Barre, was held this 22d day of January, 1913, at which were present Mayor Placide Robin and Aldermen Dejean, Landry and LeBlanc.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Dejean:

**AN ORDINANCE**  
No. 1 of 1913.  
Declaring it a nuisance and unlawful for any person to conduct a lewd or bawdy house within the corporate limits of the Village of Port Barre, and providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Port Barre, La., That it shall be unlawful and shall constitute a nuisance for any person, whether as proprietor, agent, manager, employee, or otherwise to conduct or occupy a house wherein lewdness or public prostitution is carried on.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That whoever shall violate the provisions of Section 1 of this ordinance shall, on conviction before the Mayor, be fined in a sum not less than ten dollars, nor more than fifty dollars, or be imprisoned for a period not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or both at the discretion of the Mayor.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That for good and sufficient reasons this ordinance shall take effect from and after its adoption.

Mr. LeBlanc moved that the ordinance be adopted, and the following voted for its adoption: Dejean, Landry and LeBlanc.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Landry:

**AN ORDINANCE**  
No. 2 of 1913.  
To adopt and make operative within the corporate limits of the Village of Port Barre, La., all of the provisions of the State Law regulating the conduct of places of business wherein liquors are sold.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Port Barre, La., That all of the provisions of the State Law regulating the conduct of places of business wherein liquors are sold shall be effective within the corporate limits of the Village of Port Barre, La.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That whoever shall violate the provisions of said State Law, herein adopted by the municipality, shall, on conviction before the Mayor, be fined or imprisoned in accordance with the State Law.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That for good and sufficient reasons this ordinance shall take effect from and after its adoption.

Mr. Dejean moved that the ordinance be adopted, and the following voted for its adoption: Dejean, Landry and LeBlanc.

Mr. J. Q. LeBlanc was authorized to have the sidewalk near his property properly repaired.

There being no further business before the Council, Mr. LeBlanc moved for adjournment, which was duly seconded by Mr. Dejean.

**FERTILIZE YOUR LAND.**

The best of our farmers will tell you that it pays to fertilize your land, no matter what kind of a crop you may plant. But you should endeavor to find out the specific elements of plant food needed by your soil, otherwise you might fail to get the necessary results of a judicious application of fertilizers.

By sending samples of your soil to the State Experiment Station you can have it analyzed free of cost and be advised of the kind of fertilizer best adapted to your crop.

Well rotted barnyard manure is good for almost every kind of soil or crop, but in the use of commercial fertilizers care should be taken to get the right kind. The three important constituents of a commercial fertilizer are nitrogen, phosphate and potash. Each of these supply a different kind of organic matter, and often a combination will work the best result. Peas (legumes) planted from year to year and turned under will supply nitrogen, besides a good supply of humus.

Cultivate less land and use more fertilizer.—Tribune.

**EDUCATION**

Submitting that the average wage of teachers in the public schools in the United States is less than that of carpenters, coal miners, factory workers and common laborers; that that country has the shortest school year in the world; that schools burn down at the rate of one for every school day in the year, and that the system of providing free textbooks is almost a century old, the Russell Sage Foundation, division of education, made its report recently on an interstate comparison of school systems. It sets forth that the average wage of teachers in the public schools is less than \$1 a day and that one State rents its convicts by the year for more than it pays its teachers, and that the amount for each child invested in school property ranges from \$4 in the state to \$151 in another. In only five states is the teacher's wage more than \$2 per day. The highest average salary paid in the United States is \$918 in California, and the lowest is \$200 in North Carolina. Thirty-six states have state-wide compulsory attendance laws and Ohio has complete legal regulation of school-house construction to insure the safety and sanitation of the buildings.—Daily Signal.

**WHAT IS A DOLLAR?**

We think the following definition of a dollar is a pretty good one: A dollar is what some men promise to pay for their parish paper. It is something a newspaper man enjoys more in anticipation than in reality. It is the price of a day's work for some men and a single night's drink for others. It is what the wife often urgently needs but seldom has. It is the power that makes or unmakes men. It is the hardest thing to get and the easiest thing to get rid of known to mankind. **School Board Proceedings.**

Supplemental Minutes of Parish Board of School Directors omitted from minutes of meeting held January 28th, 1913.

On motion of Mr. Lyman the following resolution was adopted: Whereas, the report of the Finance Committee shows that the school fund for the session of 1912-'13 will be exhausted on Feb. 28, at the end of a six months session; and

Whereas, the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education require that all departments of approved high schools be operated nine months each year; and

Whereas, it is the opinion of this Board that the high schools of the Parish are doing a valuable work in training boys and girls for citizenship, in fixing standards of morality, and maintaining them and our educational ideals; and

Whereas, the removal of our high schools from the accredited list would result in the loss of state aid, and would check the great interest the people have manifested in educational progress in recent years:

Therefore, be it resolved, That this Board respectfully urges the Town Councils in the various towns in which the high schools are located to appropriate sufficient funds to maintain them the remainder of the nine months session.
