### MELVILLE PROCEEDINGS.

The following ordinance was read as follows:

### ORDINANCE NO. 26.

An ordinance to prohibit the renting, letting or leasing of property for houses of prostitution, assignation or other immoral or disorderly purposes, and to prohibit the conducting of such places within one thousand feet of any church or school house or saloon or bar room, etc., and prohibit the congregation and loitering of undesirable persons about saloons, bar rooms, hotels, restaurants and boarding houses, and providing a penalty for the same.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Melville, La., That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to give, rent or lease any place, house, room or rooms for the purpose of prostitution, assignation or other im-

moral or disorderly purposes within one thousand feet of any church, school or any other house used for religious worship or school purposes, or any place conducting as a bar room, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloon, grog shop, beer house, beer garden or other place where spirituous liquor or malt liquor or intoxicating beverages are sold in the Town of Melville, La.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to conduct or cause to be conducted any place, house, room or rooms of prostitution, assignation or disorderly purposes within one thousand feet of any church, or school or any house used for religious worship or school purposes or any place conducting as a bar room, cabaret, coffee house, cafe, beer saloon, liquor exchange, drinking saloons, grog shop, beer house, beer garden, or other places where spirituous liquor or malt liquor or intoxicating beverages are sold in the town of Melville, La.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons conducting a saloon, bar room, or any place where spirituous liquor or malt liquor or intoxicating beverages are sold or hotel, boarding houses or restaurants to allow or permit any prostitute, disreputable person, vagrant or otherwise to loiter or assemble around such places.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That any person or persons, firm or corporation found guilty of any of the foregoing provisions shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not less than \$10.00 (Ten Dollars) nor more than \$100.00 (One Hundred Dollars) and may be imprisoned not less than Ten days nor more than Thirty days or both at the discretion of the court.

Sec. 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage. Thus done and passed in special session convened on this the eleventh day of February, 1913, A. D.

Moved by R. H. Jones, seconded by C. A. Long and carried, That Ordinance No. 26 do now pass. On call of the roll the following vote was taken: Yeas: R. H. Jones, C. A. Long, E. G. Richard, C. W. Stone and W. T. Smith. Nays, none.

Ordinance No. 27 was then read as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 27. To define a disorderly house, what constitutes vagrancy and fixing a penalty therefor, and repealing all laws and parts of laws in conflict therewith.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Melville, La., That a disorderly house is hereby defined as any house of public entertainment or a public resort or open to the public, conducted in such a manner as to disturb the public peace and quiet of the neighborhood, also any place in which lewd dancing is permitted or in which lewd pictures are accessible to view or any house used for purposes of prostitution or assignation outside the limits fixed by ordinance for houses of that character, provided that the use of any room or any part of the building for any of the purposes, or in any of the ways herein above enumerated shall constitute such rooms or such parts of a disorderly house.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That any male person who habitually associates with prostitutes, or who habitually loiters in or around houses of prostitution, or who being without visible means of support and lives with a prostitute, shall be deemed guilty of vagrancy.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the term visible means of support as used in this ordinance shall be construed to mean reasonably continuous employment at some lawful occupation for reasonable compensation or a fixed and regular income from property or other investment which income is sufficient for the support and maintenance of such person.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage. Thus done in special session convened on this the eleventh day of February, 1913, A. D.
