AN ORDINANCE
Ordering a special election in the Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, upon the petition of more than one-third of the property tax payers of the said Village of Sunset, entitled to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, requiring the same for the purpose of taking the sense of the property tax payers of the Village of Sunset, extending to and including the year 1922, provided that the total amount to be levied and realized from said tax by the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY shall not exceed the sum of twenty-eight hundred dollars (\$2,800.00). The said three and one-half mill tax shall cease and terminate whenever the said amount of twenty-eight hundred dollars shall have been realized and turned over to the Louisiana Traction and Power Company, its successors or assigns, under the terms and subject to the limitations placed in the petition for the said election.

Whereas, a petition has been received from the property taxpayers residing in the Village of Sunset, entitled to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, at a special election called according to law, to levy a special tax in aid of a railway enterprise, as is provided by article 270 of the constitution of the State of Louisiana, adopted in 1898 and act No. 202 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1910, and the said petition having been signed by a number of property taxpayers residing in the said Village of Sunset, and under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, qualified to participate in said election, in excess of one-third of the number as was ascertained by an examination of said petition and the assessment rolls of said Village of Sunset for the year 1912, and the registration books showing the registered voters of the Village of Sunset, and a certified list furnished by the sheriff and tax collector giving the names of the persons in said village who had paid their poll taxes for the years 1911 and 1912, the words and terms of this petition, as well as the signatures thereto annexed, being as follows, to-wit:

To the Honorable the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana.
We, the undersigned property tax payers of the Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, and entitled to vote therein on the proposition hereinafter mentioned, respectfully petition and memorialize your Honorable Body to order a special election, according to law, of the property tax payers of the said Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, entitled to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, the object and purpose of such election being for the purpose of levying a tax to realize the sum of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,800.00); said amount of TWENTY EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,800.00) to be realized by the imposition of a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar per annum on all the assessable property of the Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, for a period of ten years, beginning with the year 1913, and extending to and including the year 1922, in aid of a railway enterprise, and all in favor of the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, a corporation organized under the laws of this state and domiciled in the city of Lafayette, Louisiana, its successors or assigns, provided that the total amount to be levied and realized by the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY shall not exceed the sum of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS and said three and one-half mill tax shall cease and terminate whenever the said amount of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS shall have been realized and turned over to the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns; said tax of three and one-half mills to be thus levied and collected in aid of a railway enterprise and for the benefit and in favor of said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns, as a consideration and inducement for and to aid said company in doing and performing all of the following, to-wit:

1st. The said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY shall construct and operate an Electric Interurban Railway Line from the city of Lafayette, Louisiana, up to and into the VILLAGE OF SUNSET, PARISH OF ST. LANDRY, State of Louisiana.
2nd. The said Standard Gauge Electric Interurban Railway Line shall be constructed between the points hereinafter recited within eighteen months from the time the result of the special election herein prayed for is promulgated, provided, that any delay not caused by the fault or negligence of said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, in the nature of strikes, panics, failure of manufacturers to deliver materials, or sub-contractors to complete work, on contract time, litigation of any character, retarding the said construction of said railway, or any unforeseen circumstances beyond the control of said company, then there shall be added to the period hereinabove stated, a further delay equal to the time during which construction or operation of said railway was thus retarded or delayed.
3rd. The said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY shall operate and maintain from and after the completion of the said road, an electric interurban railway for the carriage of passengers, freight, mail, packages, and express matter between the points hereinabove named.
4th. The tax to be levied and collected and the annual amount shall not be paid to the said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY until the said Electric Interurban line shall have been built and in operation and the other conditions hereinabove set forth shall have been complied with.
5th. It is understood, however, that any extension of the Electric Interurban Railway line in question after reaching the points hereinabove named, shall in no wise affect the tax herein provided for, it being simply the purpose to predicate the imposition and collection of the tax upon the electric interurban line being constructed between the points hereinabove named, but which may be continued to reach other points.

6th. That should said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY desire to avail itself of the right to collect the amount of the tax voted in favor of such railway enterprise, it shall as evidence of this intention and its good faith, deposit within four months from the day that the result of the election has been duly promulgated and declared to have resulted in favor of the proposition submitted, in a bank which shall then be a fiscal agent of the parish of St. Landry, an amount equal to five per centum of the total amount of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS to be derived from the said tax which amount shall remain so deposited with said bank and be held by it as a forfeit and until the said LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY shall have constructed the Interurban Electric Railway line as in the manner provided by section two (2) of this petition provided, however, that in the event the conditions stipulated in said section two are not complied with, then the amount so deposited shall be considered as forfeited and the bank at which said money is deposited shall be authorized to turn same over to the Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, parish, of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to be appropriated and used by said Board of Aldermen for the public schools of the Village of Sunset, Louisiana.

SECTION I.
Be it therefore ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, in open session convened, that a special election be and is hereby ordered called, to be held in the Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, within 10 hours provided by law, on Saturday, the 8th day of March, A. D. nineteen hundred and thirteen, at which election shall be submitted to the property tax payers of the said Village of Sunset who, under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, are entitled to vote at said election, the question of imposing, levying and collecting a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar per annum on all of the assessable property situated in the Village of Sunset, State of Louisiana, for a maximum period of ten years, said tax to be imposed, levied and collected in aid of a railway enterprise, and all in favor of the Louisiana Traction and Power Company, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Louisiana, its successors or assigns; the said tax to be imposed, levied and collected according to law, and conformably to the terms, conditions and limitations recited in the hereinabove petition, beginning with the year 1913 and extending to and including the year 1922, or until the sum of twenty-eight hundred dollars (\$2,800.00) shall have been collected and turned over to the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns.

SECTION II.
Be it Further Ordained, etc., that said election shall be held under the general election laws of the State of Louisiana, so far as applicable, and that the polling place shall be Sibille Hall, situated in the Village of Sunset, the place at which the last preceding general election was held, and that the form of ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows:

FOR a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar per annum on all of the assessable property situated in the Village of Sunset, to be imposed, levied and collected in aid of a railway enterprise, and in favor of, for the benefit, and in aid of the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns, said tax to be imposed, levied and collected, beginning with the year 1913, and extending to and including the year 1922, so as to realize the sum of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,800.00), provided that in case the sum of TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,800.00) be collected and turned over to said company before the expiration of the ten years, that the said tax shall cease as soon as this sum is collected and turned over to the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns.

SECTION III.
Be it further Ordained, etc., that the Board of Supervisors of the Parish of St. Landry be and are hereby requested to appoint commissioners and clerks of election to serve in the premises, to give due notice of said appointments and of the time and place of holding said election, and make their return of said election to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, as required by law; and that the Mayor of the Village of Sunset, be and he is hereby authorized to issue his proclamation notifying the voters in said village that said election will be held, giving the date thereof, the place of holding said election, the names of the commissioners and clerks as selected by

the Board of Supervisors, and further give notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, will meet in extra session to duly promulgate the returns.

SECTION IV.
Be it further ordained, etc., That on the first legal day following that on which the Board of Supervisors of the parish of St. Landry have made their returns of said election to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, in the manner provided by section three of this ordinance, that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset shall meet at the hour of eleven (11) A. M., and then and there, and according to law, make a true compiled statement as shown by the face of the returns of the commissioners and of the Board of Supervisors of election and make public proclamation of such result.

SECTION V.
Be it further ordained, etc., that the Commissioners of Election as hereinabove appointed shall receive the ballots of any and all property taxpayers of the Village of Sunset, who are, under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, entitled to vote in said special election upon which ballot the voter or voters shall have endorsed or caused to be endorsed his name and the property to be voted before depositing the same in the ballot box.

SECTION VI.
Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall be published in the official journal of the parish of St. Landry during the period of thirty clear days prior to the date of said election and there being no newspaper published in said village, by posting during said period at three or more public places within the corporate limits, and that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.

Thus done, read, adopted and signed and seal affixed in open session at Sunset, Louisiana, parish of St. Landry, this 8th day of March, A. D. nineteen hundred and thirteen.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend and re-enact section one of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance ordering a special election in the Village of Sunset, Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, upon the petition of more than one-third of the property tax payers of the said Village of Sunset, entitled to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, requiring the same for the purpose of taking the sense of the property tax payers of the Village of Sunset, entitled to vote under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, on the proposition of granting to the Louisiana Traction and Power Company, its successors or assigns, a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar per annum on the assessable property situated in the Village of Sunset, for a maximum period of ten years, beginning with the year 1913 and extending to and including the year 1922, provided that the total amount to be levied and realized from said tax by the Louisiana Traction and Power Company shall not exceed the sum of Twenty-eight Hundred Dollars. The said three and one-half mill tax shall cease and terminate whenever the said amount of Twenty-eight Hundred

DOLLARS (\$2,800.00) be collected and turned over to said company before the expiration of the ten years, that the said tax shall cease as soon as this sum is collected and turned over to the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns.

Be it further ordained, etc., that the Board of Supervisors of the Parish of St. Landry be and are hereby requested to appoint commissioners and clerks of election to serve in the premises, to give due notice of said appointments and of the time and place of holding said election, and make their return of said election to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, as required by law; and that the Mayor of the Village of Sunset, be and he is hereby authorized to issue his proclamation notifying the voters in said village that said election will be held, giving the date thereof, the place of holding said election, the names of the commissioners and clerks as selected by

the Board of Supervisors, and further give notice that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Village of Sunset, will meet in extra session to duly promulgate the returns.

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Thus done, read, adopted and signed and seal affixed in open session at Sunset, Louisiana, parish of St. Landry, this 8th day of March, A. D. nineteen hundred and thirteen.

D. 1913, at which election shall be submitted to the property taxpayers of the said Village of Sunset, who, under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, are entitled to vote at said election, the question of imposing, levying and collecting a special tax of three and one-half mills on the dollar per annum on all of the assessable property situated in the Village of Sunset, parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, for a maximum period of ten years, said tax to be imposed, levied and collected in aid of a railway enterprise, and all in favor of the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Louisiana, its successors or assigns; the said tax to be imposed, levied and collected according to law and conformably to the terms, conditions and limitations recited in the hereinabove petition, beginning with the year 1913, and extending to and including the year 1922, or until the sum of twenty-eight hundred dollars (\$2,800.00) shall have been collected and turned over to the LOUISIANA TRACTION AND POWER COMPANY, its successors or assigns.
