GEORGE MORTIMER PULLMAN.

Pullman was born in a family of moderate circumstances, and at the age of fourteen went to work in a small store as a boy-of-all-work. At seventeen, he went to work for his older brother as a cabinet maker. The knowledge gained at this work proved to be valuable to him in after years.

He carefully saved his earnings, and at the age of twenty-one, had a few dollars with which to begin business. At this time the Erie Canal was in process of widening, and all sorts of buildings had to be removed, so young Pullman began making contracts. This work proved profitable, and soon after he moved to Chicago and continued in this business.

In 1838 he became interested in the sleeping car problem. The cars in use then contained three tiers of shelves on each side of the car and were far from comfortable. He began experimenting, and in a few years built the first Pullman Car, the "Pioneer" at a cost of \$15,000.

Success came step by step, and in 1851-52, the gross earnings of the company amounted to more than ten million dollars. Today they pay from twenty-five to seventy-five thousand dollars for each Pullman car.
