School Board Proceedings.

Opelousas, Aug. 18th, 1913. The Parish Board of School Directors met in special session. Present: Dr. O. P. Daly, President; H. D. Larcade, J. A. Perkins, Edgar Andrepont, Regis Boudreau, R. L. Hawkins, Frank Fontenot, W. B. Baker, J. W. Lyman and a quorum.

Pursuant to a resolution passed on the 7th day of July, 1913, and in conformity with notice given by the proclamation of the President of this Board, duly published, the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., met in special open session for the purpose of opening the ballot boxes, examining and counting the ballots, in number and amount, examining and canvassing the returns and declaring the result of the special election held in the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, on the 14th day of August, 1913, in conformity with a resolution of this Board passed on the 7th day of July, 1913. Present; Dr. O. P. Daly, President; H. D. Larcade, J. A. Perkins, Edgar Andrepont, Regis Boudreau, R. L. Hawkins, Frank Fontenot, W. B. Baker, J. W. Lyman, and a quorum.

PROPOSITION.

Proposition to levy annually a special tax of three mills on the dollar on all taxable property in said Parish of St. Landry, saving and excepting that located in Bayou Boeuf School District No. 31, subject to state taxation, for the period of five years, beginning with the year 1913, for the purpose of giving additional aid to public schools.

For, or in favor of said proposition there were cast 231 votes, representing a taxable assessed property valuation of three hundred and sixteen thousand nine hundred and eighty-two dollars (\$316,982.00).

And against, or in opposition to, said proposition, there were cast 438 votes, representing a taxable assessed property valuation of eight hundred and twenty-eight thousand five hundred and eighty-two dollars \$828,582.00.

Whereupon Mr. Lyman offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Whereas, the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, has, in open session opened the ballot boxes, examined and counted the ballots in number and amount, examined and canvassed the returns of the special election held in the Parish of St. Landry, La., saving and excepting that portion of said parish included in Bayou Boeuf School District No. 31, on the 14th day of August, 1913, in conformity with a resolution of this Board ordering said election, passed on the 7th day of July, 1913, and ascertain the result of said election to be as set forth hereafter in this resolution.

Section 1. Be it resolved by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, That the result of the special election in the Parish of St. Landry, La., saving and excepting that portion of said parish included in Bayou Boeuf School District No. 31, held on August 14th, 1913, in conformity with a resolution of this Board ordering said election, passed on the 7th day of July, 1913, and is hereby declared to be as follows:

PROPOSITION.

Proposition to levy annually a three mill tax on the dollar on all taxable property in said Parish of St. Landry, saving and excepting that located in Bayou Boeuf School District No. 31, subject to state taxation, for the period of five years, beginning

with the year 1913, for the purpose of giving additional aid to public schools.

For, or in favor of, said proposition there were cast 231 votes, representing a taxable assessed property valuation of three hundred and sixteen thousand nine hundred and eighty-two dollars, and against, or in opposition to, said proposition there were cast 438 votes, representing a taxable assessed property valuation of eight hundred and twenty-eight thousand five hundred and eighty-two dollars (\$828,582.00).

And a majority in both number and amount of the votes cast at said election were against said proposition.

And said proposition is hereby declared to have been defeated at said special election.

Section 2. Be it further resolved, etc., That the Secretary of this Board be, and he is hereby directed to file with the Secretary of State of the State of Louisiana, and with the Clerk of the 16th Judicial District Court and ex-officio Recorder in and for the Parish of St. Landry, La., each one copy of the minutes of this meeting, to and including the passage of this resolution, same constituting a process verbal of the manner in which the ballot boxes have been opened, the ballots counted in number and amount, the returns canvassed and the result of the said special election ascertained; and said Secretary shall retain in his office a copy hereof, together with other copies hereof, duly certified by the Secretary of State and said Clerk and ex-officio Recorder to have been duly filed and recorded in their respective offices, as required by law.

Unanimously adopted.

To the President and Members of the Parish Board of School Directors of St. Landry Parish, La.

Gentlemen:

Your committee appointed to report on the status of the title to the property now occupied as the site of the St. Landry High School at Opelousas, La., respectfully beg to submit the following as their report covering that subject:

We obtained the original act of sale to the property wherein it was conveyed to the Board of Police of the town of Opelousas. We submitted this act of sale to Mr. R. L. Galand, attorney of this Board for his opinion. His advice was that the title was vested in the city of Opelousas, but that the property or the proceeds arising therefrom could only be used by the city for public school purposes; that the city could only dispose of the property by virtue of a special Act of the legislature authorizing it to do so, and he advised that a bill to that effect be presented to the legislature at its next session for enactment.

On motion of Mr. Lyman the report of the committee was accepted and ordered filed and the committee discharged.

On motion of Mr. Lyman the Treasurer was instructed to refund to Floyd Robertson one dollar for poll tax erroneously paid.

The claim of Ambrose Justice for refund of poll tax was rejected for the reason that the poll tax was due and uncollected at the time it was paid.

On motion of Mr. Hawkins the claim of Mr. A. J. Cormier, for hauling wire to the Port Barre school house, was approved for one and 50-100 dollars and ordered paid.
