School Board Proceedings.

Opelousas, August 23rd, 1913.—

The Parish Board of School Directors of St. Landry Parish, La. met in special session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Dr. O. P. Daly, President, H. D. Lardade, Jr., J. A. Perkins, Edgar Andrepoint, Dr. L. A. Guidry, Dr. A. C. Durio, Regis Boudreau, R. L. Hawkins, Arthur Fogleman, J. G. Carriere, W. B. Baker, Frank Fontenot, J. W. Lyman, and a quorum.

This meeting having been called for the special purpose of reconsidering a resolution passed on August 18th, 1913, providing for a cut of ten per cent in the salaries of all teachers in the public schools of this parish. Carriere offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Whereas, a resolution was passed at a meeting of this Board held on August 18th, 1913, providing for a cut of ten per cent in the salaries of all teachers in the public schools of this parish, and whereas at the same meeting of said Board a resolution was also passed for the reconsideration of the above resolution at a future meeting of this Board. Now, therefore be it resolved by this Board that the resolution providing for the cut of ten per cent in the salaries of all teachers in the public schools in this parish at this late day is inopportune and ill advised, and would demoralize and disorganize the teaching force in the public schools of this parish; that while, under the circumstances, technically, it might have the right to make the proposed cut, it considers itself under a moral obligation to carry out its promises made to the teachers with reference to their salaries when they accepted the positions tendered them, and with the end in view to preserve the integrity of this Board with reference to carrying out its moral responsibilities, and at the same time conserve and advance the efficiency of its public school system, be it further resolved that the resolution providing for said cut in salaries be annulled and rescinded, and that the salaries of all teachers employed in the public schools of this parish stand as originally fixed by this Board at the time of their employment.

On a call of the Yeas and Nays the vote stood as follows, viz: Yeas: Daly, Durio, Hawkins, Fogleman, Carriere, Guidry, Baker, Fontenot, Lyman. Nays: Perkins, Andrepoint, Boudreau.

Larcade voting blank. And the resolution to rescind was carried.

On motion of Mr. Lyman the Superintendent was authorized to pay out of the Eunice High School fund the following claims: Dudley Berwick, lumber for High School \$ 7 25 Chas. Read, making cabinet for High School 10 00 Refund poll tax to Andrew Adkins 1 00

On motion of Mr. Lyman the Board adjourned subject to call. O. P. DALY, President.


