



Opelousas, La., Sept. 15, 1913.  
To the Hon. Mayor and members of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La.

Gentlemen:  
You are hereby notified that there will be a meeting of your Board this Monday evening, Sept. 15th, 1913, at 7:00 o'clock for the purpose of receiving report of committee on building sidewalks,

and to take such action thereon as may be necessary; for the further purpose of discussing and taking action on any matter referring to systematizing the working of the streets; for the further purpose of adopting a resolution with reference to \$5000 loan for purchasing additional engine, etc., for the power plant; for the further purpose of advertising for bids for paving certain streets with gravel; for the further purpose of adopting an ordinance relative to bond

issue; for the further purpose of discussing the subject of building a concrete bridge over Bayou Tesson on Landry street; for the further purpose of adopting an ordinance prohibiting the driving of stock through the streets of this city unless same are driven so as not to be allowed to go upon paved sidewalks; for the further purpose of compelling the sewerage contractors to level the streets after making connections; for the further purpose of ordering the covering of sewer

The Board of Aldermen met in special session pursuant to the above call, present E. L. Loeb, Mayor, presiding Aldermen, Shaw, Blacksher, Danel, Stelly, and Dunbar.

All the members being present the meeting was called to order.

To the Honorable Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La.

We, the undersigned citizens and taxpayers of the City of Opelousas, La., owning property abutting Landry street in said city, respectfully petition your Honorable Body to pave said street with Tioga Gravel from its intersection with Main street on the east, to its intersection with the tracks of the Morgan Louisiana and Texas Railroad and Steam Ship Company on the west. Your petitioners hereby obligate themselves to pay Two-Thirds of the cost of said paving and leave to the discretion of your Honorable Body, the specifications of laying same, provided it does not cost over Seventy-Five Cents a front foot.

That the above petition be received and filed and the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to advertise for bids in compliance with the above petition, as per plans and specifications furnished by the City Engineer, said bids to be received up to 12:00 o'clock noon, Oct. 7th, 1913, and be opened at the regular meeting of the same date. Motion duly seconded and carried.

On motion of Mr. Danel—

Be it resolved, That the Street Commissioner be and is hereby instructed and required to make a daily detailed report of all work performed by him. Said report to give kind of work, location and cost. Be it further resolved, That the said reports be tabulated and summarized by the Clerk of the body so as to show, 1st, Ward; 2d, Street; 3d, Cost of work in each block; 4th, Cost of work on each bridge. Said tabulation or report to be prepared and presented by the clerk to the council at its monthly meetings, a copy to be given each member at said meetings. Be it further resolved, That the said Street Commissioner be and he is hereby instructed to furnish to the clerk or any member of the council, any further information required.

Mr. Danel explains that the object and purpose of this resolution is to place each member of the council in a position to judge of the work done; the cost; the location, etc., and further to regulate the expenditure in the different wards to the end that said expenditure may be equitably distributed throughout the city; further to endeavor through the joint knowledge of the body to improve and economize the Street work. Seconded by Stelly.

That the Mayor be and he is

hereby authorized to advertise for bids for a concrete bridge over Bayou Tesson on Landry Street, according to plans and specifications to be furnished by the City Engineer. Said bids to be received up to 12:00 o'clock noon, Oct. 7th, 1913, and opened at the regular meeting of the same date. Motion duly seconded and carried.

Motion by Mr. Dunbar—

That the Street Commissioner be instructed to notify the sewerage contractors to level all streets where they made sewer connections and in case they fail to comply with the order in twenty-four hours after said notification, that he is hereby authorized to proceed against them in accordance with the ordinance governing same. Motion duly seconded and carried.

Motion by Dr. Shaw—

That the Mayor be authorized to ask for bids, per cubic yard, for hauling dirt on South street for the purpose of filling over sewer pipes, as per specifications furnished by the City Engineer, said bids to be received up to 12:00 o'clock noon, Oct. 7th, 1913, and opened at the same meeting of said date. Motion duly seconded and carried.

The Mayor appoints on the Committee on Inventory the following: Mr. A. C. Jones, Supt., M. Halphen, St. Com., C. P. Dunbar, Councilmen.

On motion duly seconded and carried the meeting of the Board of Aldermen was adjourned to Wednesday, Sept. 17th, 1913, at 5:00 p. m.
