

Opelousas, La., Oct. 6th, 1913.
The Police Jury convened in regular session this sixth day of October, 1913, with the following members present:

Dr. Clopton, President; Messrs. St. Cyr, Dimmick, Dailey, Iseringhausen, Brown, Walters, Beall, McCaffery, Gournay, Durio, Guillory, Fisette, Dunbar, Mr. Dailey called to the Chair. On motion of Mr. St. Cyr—The Police Jury adjourned until 1:30 o'clock p. m.

EVENING SESSION.

The Police Jury met pursuant to adjournment.
Present: Dr. Clopton, President; Messrs. St. Cyr, Durio, Guillory, Dailey, Iseringhausen, Fisette, Dunbar, Brown, Walters, Beall, McCaffery, Foster, Gournay, Dimmick.

Motion by Mr. Dimmick—That the subject matter relative to hogs roaming at large in the 8th and 9th Justice of the Peace Wards of the 4th Police Jury ward, be tabled until next regular meeting. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. McCaffery—Be it resolved that a warrant for the sum of six hundred and seventy and 45-100 dollars, (\$670.45) be issued to the Washington State Bank, for cash advanced as first payment on oil tractor, purchased for the 4th and 5th wards of the parish; and be it further resolved that two certificates of indebtedness be issued to the International Harvester Co., for balance due on said oil tractor; said certificates to be in the sum of ten hundred and twenty dollars each, with 8 per cent per annum interest from Sept. 6th, 1913, and made payable March 1st, 1914, and March 1st, 1915, out of the 4th and 5th wards of the parish.
