#### Proclamation of Election.

City of Opelousas,  
Parish of St. Landry,  
State of Louisiana.

Whereas, more than twenty-five per centum (25) of the duly qualified electors of the City of Opelousas, La., have petitioned me, the undersigned Mayor of said City, to call a special election in conformity with the provisions of Act 207 of the General Assembly of Louisiana of the year 1912, for the purpose of determining whether or not said City shall be organized under the form of government provided by said Act, and commonly known as the "Commission Form of Government," and

Whereas, the provisions of said Act make it incumbent upon me to issue my proclamation calling special election when the

proper petition, containing the requisite number of signatures of qualified electors of said City, is presented to me in due and proper form, and

Whereas, such petition has been filed in my office, in proper manner and form as required by said Act, on the 17th, day of October 1913; therefore, I do hereby issue this my

#### PROCLAMATION

fixing and setting aside Tuesday, November 25th, 1913, as the day for holding an election to take the sense of the duly qualified voters of the City of Opelousas, La., on the following proposition, viz:

Shall the proposition to organize the City of Opelousas, La., under Act 207 of 1912, of the General Assembly, be adopted.

Said election to be held within the legal hours on said date at the regularly designated polling places in said City, and in conformity with the election laws of the State of Louisiana.

I do hereby appoint the following Commissioners and Clerks to serve for their respective wards at said election.

1st. Ward Commissioners—F. C. Jennings, Ludovic Fontenot, S. L. Hebrard; Clerk, Gus E. Dupre.

2d. Ward Commissioners—B. L. Sanders, Jos. Guidry, Aug. Amy; Clerk, H. D. Larcade, Sr.

3d. Ward Commissioners—Preston Hollier, H. D. Littell, F. P. Butler; Clerk, C. T. Griffith.

4th. Ward Commissioners—Henry Chachere, Allen Dezauche, Louis Meginley; Clerk, J. B. A. Stagg.

#### AN ORDINANCE.

No. 21 of 1913.

Confirming and ratifying the contract entered into by the City of Opelousas, through its Mayor, with August Mietz of New York City, doing business under the name of August Mietz Iron Foundry & Machine Works, on the 5th day of September, 1913, for the purchase of one, one hundred and fifty horse power three cylinder vertical Meitz and Weiss Fuel Oil Engine, and to provide for the payment of the certificate of indebtedness provided for in said contract and dedicating the surplus revenues after payment necessary operating expenses of the City Water Works and Electric Light Plant, to the payment of certificates of indebtedness provided for in said contract.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, that the contract entered into by the City of Opelousas, through its Mayor, E. L. Loeb, on September 5th, 1913, with August Mietz of New York City, for the purchase of one, one hundred and fifty horse power three cylinder vertical Meitz and Weiss Fuel Oil Engine on the terms and conditions stipulated in said contract, be and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to issue the certificates of indebtedness pro-

vided for in said contract in accordance with the terms thereof.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That said certificates of indebtedness are hereby made payable out of the excess revenues of the City Water Works and Electric Light Plant, after payment of all necessary operating and maintenance expenses and also out of any other available funds of said City of Opelousas, not otherwise appropriated.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That in order to secure the payment of said certificates of indebtedness at maturity as provided for in said certificates; the excess revenues of the City Water Works and Electric Light Plant, over and above ordinary operating and maintenance expenses for the years 1914 and 1915, are hereby specially set aside and dedicated to the payment and retirement of the twenty certificates of indebtedness provided for in the contract referred to in Section 1 of this ordinance, which said certificates of indebtedness are of the denominations and terms following, to-wit:

The first fifteen of the said certificates, being each for the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00); and the last five of the said certificates being each for the sum of Four Hundred and Fourteen Dollars and 20-100 (\$414.20), bearing five per cent per annum interest from date until paid, and payable as follows: the first of said certificates, thirty days after arrival of engine and the balance payable one every thirty days thereafter.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That for good and sufficient reasons this ordinance take effect from and after its passage.

Board, this Wednesday evening, November, 12th, 1913, at 7:00 o'clock, p. m. for the purpose of adopting a budget for the year 1914, for the City of Opelousas, La., and for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor to advertise for a fiscal agent for said City for said year, and for the further purpose of conferring with the Sewerage Board with reference to sewer connections on streets to be paved, and to adopt such ordinances as may be necessary relative to same.

That the City Engineer be and he is hereby directed to notify the owners of property abutting Landry, Main, Bellevue, and Court streets, to connect with the Sewer and water mains on said streets within the area to be paved with Wood Blocks; said connections to be with the sewer and water mains and up to the property line of said abutting owners said connections to be made within ten (10) days from receipt of said notice.

Seconded by Mr. Stelly.

Yeas: Shaw, Blacksher, Danel, Stelly, Dunbar. Nays: None.

Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Danel—

That the budget Committee be allowed until December, 2nd, 1913, to make its report, and that action on the matter of advertising for a Fiscal agent be deferred until said date.

Motion duly seconded and carried.

On motion duly seconded and carried the meeting of the Board of Aldermen was adjourned, subject to call.
