Dr. F. O. Pavy offered the following ordinance and upon being duly read was adopted unanimously, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE

Amending Sections 2 and 3 of the ordinance of the Police Jury of the parish of St. Landry, adopted at its meeting held on February 2nd, 1914, and being entitled an "Ordinance relative to the construction and building of permanent gravel roads in the parish of St. Landry, and the setting aside of a fixed sum therefor and the appointment of a committee to supervise the same."

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of St. Landry, in regular session convened, that sections two and three of the ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to construction and building of permanent gravel roads in the parish of St. Landry, and the setting aside of a fixed sum therefor and the appointment of a committee to supervise the same," be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of this body, the Supervisor of public roads and one member of this body to be selected and appointed by the President, be and they are hereby constituted a committee on good roads whose duty it shall be to supervise, superintend, build or have built, by contract or otherwise, the building of gravel roads as provided for by this ordinance and between the points hereinafter mentioned.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That said committee on good roads be and it is hereby empowered and authorized to use out of the above mentioned funds set aside for the building of said permanent roads a sum not to exceed eight thousand dollars for the purchase of any and all machinery, tools, graders, etc., necessary for the building of said gravel roads, and said committee is hereby further authorized to purchase such material and to contract for such labor as may be required to build and construct said roads and to issue vouchers for such material purchased, or labor performed, which vouchers, when properly signed, on presentation, shall be paid by the Clerk of this body, by warrant against said permanent road fund, duly signed by the President of this body.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the provisions of the ordinance adopted on Feb. 2, 1914, in conflict with this ordinance, be and the same is hereby repealed and that this ordinance for good and sufficient reason take effect from and after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE

Relative to constructing and building of permanent gravel roads in the Parish of St. Landry, and the setting aside a fixed sum therefor, and the appointing of a Committee to supervise the same.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry in regular session convened, That there be set aside, out of the revenues obtained from the recent bond issue floated by this parish, a fixed sum of Seventy-Five Thousand dollars, the same to be used exclusively for the building of permanent gravel roads.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of this body, the Supervisor of Public Roads, and the Clerk of the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, be and they are hereby appointed a COMMITTEE ON GOOD ROADS, whose duty it shall be to supervise the building of gravel roads between the points hereinafter mentioned in this ordinance.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That the above mentioned Committee on Good Roads be and they are hereby authorized to use out of the above mentioned funds set aside for the building of permanent roads, a sum not to exceed Eight Thousand dollars for the purchase of any and all machinery, tools, graders, etc., for the building of gravel roads.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That said Committee on Good Roads are hereby vested with the power to have the roads hereinafter mentioned straightened out as they may see fit and proper, and to do any and all things necessary in the premises, should the property owners along said roads be not willing to donate the property where said roads are to be changed, either by buying or by expropriation.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That the roads to be built shall be: First: From the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas to the corporate limits of the Town of Washington, a distance of 4.82 miles. Second: From the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas to the corporate limits of the Town of Sunset, a distance of 3.50 miles. Third: From the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas to the Town of Lawtell, a distance of 6.25 miles; Fourth: From the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas to Little Bayou Carriere, near Port Barre, a distance of 5.03 miles.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Committee on Good Roads shall make a report to the Police Jury at its regular meetings on the First Monday of every month, of any and all work done by said Committee. They shall also have kept a regular monthly account of all purchases made by said Committee and all disbursements out of the above mentioned fund, and in their report to this body, each and every month, shall specially mention the same.

Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., That the kind of gravel to be used shall be left entirely to the Committee, said Committee, however, shall in no place build a road other than what is termed an 8 foot road.

Section 8. Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, and that all ordinances contrary to or inconsistent with this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.
