

### FARMERS TO GET TOP PRICES FOR CORN

Care Should Be Taken In Harvesting Crop So As To Get Best Price.

Stokes-Stelly Produce Company, one of the biggest corn buying firms in Southwest Louisiana, is making every preparation necessary to secure the corn growers of this section the top market price.

The company recently received a letter from the Wilson Grain Company of Natchitoches, Texas, which company Mr. Stokes represents in this section of the state; the Texas firm is depending a great deal on Louisiana for its corn, as the Texas crop is very poor and it consequently will pay much higher prices than corn growers in St. Landry have heretofore been receiving.

The letter received by the Stokes-Stelly Co. might prove of great interest to those who intend selling their surplus corn: "We wish to appeal to you to adopt such measures as are necessary to insure better inspection and better service on corn. "If your corn is properly handled and only the best dry merchantable stock marketed, you could get a much better price for it, as the consumers in Texas are liberal in their patronage to those that merit it, and it is needless to point out the confidence that naturally follows the receipt of a shipment of corn that is satisfactory in every particular.

"The prospects for corn in Texas are very poor at this writing, and if satisfactory arrangements can be made to insure our getting the exact quality and quantity of corn bought, we hope to do a large business with you the coming season." It is expected that St. Landry farmers will ship several carloads of corn this season, even more than last year, and that they will receive top market prices.

Corn growers are warned that the proper harvesting and handling of the corn crop is most essential for the demand of a good price; if the St. Landry farmers choose the best corn for exportation, keeping the nubbins for their own use it is evident that they will receive much better prices for their goods, than if the corn is mixed.

Harvesting the corn will begin in the next few weeks and if estimates are correct Opelousas will ship its share of corn to Texas and other points where the crop has failed this season.
