By virtue of a judgment of the Honorable B. H. Pavy, Judge of the Sixteenth Judicial District Court, sitting in and for the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana rendered in the above-numbered and entitled cause on the 18th day of November, 1914, and pursuant to a commission issued in conformity with said judgment by Charles F. Baily, deputy clerk of said Court, of date Nov. 18, 1914, authorizing and empowering the undersigned to sell at public auction, after legal advertisement, all of the property, real and personal, rights and credits of the Union Irrigation Company, there will be sold by the undersigned, either in person or through a duly qualified auctioneer or ex-officio auctioneer of the Parish of St. Landry named by the undersigned, at the principal front door of the Courthouse in the City of Opelousas, of said Parish, on

SATURDAY, JANUARY, 9, 1915, beginning at the hour of 11:00 o'clock A. M., and continuing until the whole is sold, the following described property:

1. A certain tract of land purchased from Tee J. Caldwell and known as the old Cox plantation, situated in the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, near to and adjoining the town of Washington, bounded on the north by Bayou Carren, south by the lands of Dupre and P. L. Pitre, east by the Public Road leading from Washington to Opelousas and the lands of Comeau and Laey; containing 188 acres situated in Township 5 South, Range 4 East and being the same property acquired by Tee J. Caldwell from Jacob Plonsky on May 29, 1902.

Upon this property is situated the pumping plant, the discharge basin and other improvements, and the same is to be appraised separately.

The following described properties embrace the right of way of the main canal already constructed:

2. A certain strip of land or canal right of way over through and across the following described land which was acquired from Thomas J. Lacey and by Mrs. Cook, and on the west by the land of Cleophas Comeau, which strip of land or canal right of way is the same that has been surveyed and located by the Union Irrigation Company, and containing 3 acres, more or less.

3. A certain strip of land or canal right of way 350 feet in width over, through and across the following described land which was acquired from Dora M. Wartelle, widow of Dr. G. A. M. Cooke, situated in St. Landry Parish, Louisiana, near the town of Washington, containing 137 acres, more or less, bounded on the north by the land of T. J. Lacey and Comeau, south by the

public road leading from Plaisance to Washington, east by the public road leading from Opelousas to Washington, west by the land of Joseph Miller, which strip of land or canal right of way is the same that has been surveyed and located by the Union Irrigation Company, containing 29.7 acres, more or less.

A certain strip of land or canal right of way acquired from Godfrey Dupre, situated in St. Landry Parish, Louisiana, having a width of 350 feet, and beginning four hundred feet south of the north-west corner of a tract of land formerly owned by J. M. Boagni and the Union Irrigation Company; thence by said irrigation company's land north 88 degrees, 53 minutes; west, 286.8 feet to a stake; thence by land of said Godfrey Dupre the nine following courses and distances, to-wit: North, 30 degrees, 28 minutes; east 739.7 feet to a stake; thence by a line curving toward the north with a radius of 1317.69 feet for a distance of 217.6 feet to an iron pin; thence north 21 degrees; east, 4997.8 feet to an iron pin; thence by a line curving toward the west with a radius of 9727 feet for a distance of 115.6 feet to a stake; thence north 50 degrees, 32 minutes; west, 245.5 feet to a stake; thence by a line curving toward the north with a radius of 808.62 feet for a distance of 183.1 feet to a stake; thence north 37 degrees, 33 minutes; west, 657.7 feet to a stake; thence north 36 degrees, 14 minutes; west, 1039.6 feet to a stake; thence north 35 degrees, 51 minutes; west, 213.2 feet to a stake on line of land of the Union Irrigation Company; thence by the land of the Union Irrigation Company, north 54 degrees, 9 minutes; east, 250 feet to the place of beginning; containing 34.54 acres, more or less, which right of way is more fully described by a plat attached to the original act of sale.

9. A certain strip of land or canal right of way acquired from C. H. Comeau, being 125 feet wide and running over, through and across the land of said C. H.
