

TO ASK ACADIA TO JOIN DRAINAGE WORK

Committee From Here Going To Crowley To Take Up Matter With Jurors.

A committee composed of President Dimmick of the Police Jury, members Foster and St. Cyr and Parish Surveyor Robert will journey to Crowley on next Tuesday to take up the subject of creating a joint drainage district between that section of this country lying between Opelousas and Crowley.

Dr. Paul Foster stated that he had interviewed the most prominent members of the Acadia police jury some few weeks ago and ascertained that the majority of the jurors, as well as the taxpayers residing within the territory proposed to be formed into a large drainage district, were in favor of dredging out Bayou Plaquemine Broule and all its tributary streams.

If the committee files in a favorable report it is expected that the parish will purchase the Union Irrigation Marion dredge boat for the use of the various drainage districts now in existence and to be formed in this parish.

Some of the jurors here are in favor of allowing the proposed drainage district the privilege of purchasing the boat, should the district comprise a portion of St. Landry and Acadia parish. Others think that it would be best for St. Landry to look out for her interest and purchase the boat for the parish and to be operated by the parish.

It is reported that the taxpayers residing in and around Lewisburg are very anxious to tax themselves for drainage provided that the people of Acadia, residing south of them, are willing to share a portion of the tax, thereby assuring St. Landry taxpayers the work will in the future be accomplished to the very mouth of the Plaquemine Broule bayou.

Dr. Stubbs Suffers Operation.

Dr. G. W. Stubbs, after suffering for a number of weeks with a dissatisfied appendix, accompanied by Dr. R. M. Littell, left Saturday night for New Orleans, where he underwent an operation for appendicitis.

Relatives report that Dr. Stubbs is improving and will be back in Opelousas within a short time.

Dr. Stubbs was stricken down with appendicitis several months ago and recovered. His physicians, however, advised him that it would be best for him to have the little "troublesome thing" taken out on general principle.
