

School Board Proceedings.

Opelousas, March 9th, 1915. The Parish Board of School Directors met in special session pursuant to call by the President, Present: Dr. O. P. Daly, President, H. D. Larcade, Jr., Edgar Andrepoint, J. A. Perkins, G. Horaist, Regis Boudreau, Dr. A. C. Durio, R. L. Hawkins, Arthur Fogleman, Frank Fontenot, W. B. Baker, J. W. Lyman, and a quorum.

On motion of Mr. Andrepoint the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was dispensed with and the minutes as published were adopted. On motion of Mr. Lyman the sum of ten dollars to each of the white schools at Leonville, Lawtell and Sunset was appropriated for the purchase of library books, and the Superintendent was authorized to buy bookcases for the same.

Mr. Lyman offered the following resolution and moved its adoption: Whereas the public school fund in the parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, are insufficient to operate the public schools of said parish for a longer period than about six months per annum, and whereas the law requires all approved high schools to be operated for a session of not less than nine months in order that they may be able to complete the course outlined in the State Course Study and thereby maintain their status as approved high schools, and whereas, under present conditions, there are not sufficient funds available to operate the Eunice High School for said session of nine months, and whereas, many people in the Eunice School District in which said Eunice High School is located, have expressed a willingness to vote a special school tax, beginning with the year 1915, for the exclusive benefit of the Eunice High School and the other public schools in said school district, of four mills on the dollar on all the property in said Eunice School District, subject to state taxation annually, for the period of ten years, said tax, if carried, to be used exclusively for the maintenance and equipment of the public schools located in said Eunice District.

And, whereas, in the opinion of this Board said special school tax election is necessary and advisable. Be it now resolved by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., by virtue of the authority vested in it by Act 132 of 1912, amending Article 281 of the Constitution of 1898, as follows: Section 1. That a special school tax election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in the Eunice School District of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on Tuesday, April 20th, 1915, at which shall be submitted the following proposition to-wit:

To levy a special tax of four mills on the dollar, annually, on all the property in said Eunice School District of the Parish of St. Landry, La., subject to state taxation for the period of ten years, beginning with and including the year 1915, for the purpose of

(a) Giving additional assistance to the public schools in the Eunice School District.

(b) To assist in the maintenance, repair and equipment of said schools.

Section 2. That the Secretary of this Board is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned in section 1 of this resolution arranged in such manner as to enable the voters to vote on it in the following form:

Whereas, the public school funds of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, are insufficient to operate the public schools of said parish for a longer period than about six months per annum, and whereas, the law requires all approved high schools to be operated for a session of not less than nine months in order that they may be able to complete the course outlined in the State Course of Study and thereby maintain their status as approved high schools, and whereas, under present conditions, there are not sufficient funds available to operate the St. Landry High School for said session of nine months, nor the schools adjacent to Opelousas in the same school district for a session of sufficient length, and whereas, many people in the Opelousas School District, in which the St. Landry High School and other public schools are located, have expressed a willingness to vote a special school tax, beginning with and including the year, 1915, for the exclusive benefit of the St. Landry High School and the other public schools in the Opelousas School District, of three mills on the dollar to be levied annually for the period of five years on all the property subject to state taxation in said Opelousas School District; said tax, if carried, to be used exclusively for the maintenance and equipment of the public schools located in said Opelousas School District.

And whereas, in the opinion of this Board said special school tax election is necessary and advisable. Be it now resolved by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, by virtue of the authority vested in it by Act 132 of 1912, amending Article


