His next step was to spend the entire receipts of the first day's sales for an advertisement for the next day's business. These are radical methods but, combined with Mr. Wanamaker's personality, have won for him great success.



RURAL CARRIER EXAMINATION The United States Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for the County of St. Landry, La., to be held at Opelousas, La., on May 22, 1915, to fill the position of rural carrier at Port Barre, La., and vacancies that may later occur on rural routes from other post offices in the above mentioned county. The examination will be open only to male citizens who are actually domiciled in the territory of a post office in the county and who meet the other requirements set forth in form No. 1977.
