### MELVILLE PROCEEDINGS

Melville, La., June 1st, 1915. The Board of Aldermen met in regular session. Present, H. S. Joseph, Mayor, presiding; Aldermen W. T. Smith, P. Glaser, C. A. Long, R. H. Jones and L. H. Lyons. The minutes of the regular meeting held May 4, 1915, were read and approved.

The following reports were read, approved and ordered filed: Report of Town Marshal O. E. Hamilton for May, 1915:

Grant Brown fined \$25.00, cost \$1.00; Pearl Hauley fined \$5.00, cost \$1.00; total turned over to Town Treas. \$32.00.

Report of Town Clerk and Tax Collector, collections May 5 to 31: Regular tax, year 1914, \$8,100; special electric light tax, year 1914, \$8,48; mercantile licenses year 1915, \$5.00; dog tax year 1915, \$9.00, sundry \$2; total turned over to Town Treas. \$29.10. Also report following warrants issued since last regular meeting by order of mayor: No. 550 To J. W. Heap, for bankment of \$150.00; Anderson Offutt exchange to G. L. Dupre, in settlement, No. 551 To H. Rachal, Agent, for freight on fans, etc., \$3.13; No. 552 To H. Rachal, Agent, for freight on meters, etc., \$3.13; No. 553 To H. Rachal, Agent, for freight on electric supplies \$1.21; No. 554 To H. Rachal, Agent, for freight on one car of oil \$70.80; by order of St. Com'r.; No. 555 To Chas. Report of Marshal O. E. Hamilton that he had made the sanitary inspection of the town as instructed. Moved by Jones, seconded by Smith and carried, that the report be received.

Bill of L. H. Lyons, clerk's salary for May \$2.50; recording two trials \$2.00; 5 per cent commission on collecting (\$28.58) \$1.42; cash paid for stamps .15; writing paper .15; total bill \$32.22.

Bill of Mayor H. S. Joseph: salary for May \$16.70; tel. message \$1; express on switch board \$5.30; total bill \$22.51.

Bill of J. W. Heap, salary as treasurer for May \$1.00.

Bill of C. A. Long: for gutters for Town Hall 15 feet @ .45 \$2.25; 1 bill .15; total \$2.40.

Bill of H. A. B. Gray: for 28 hours services as consulting engineer @ \$1.00, \$28.00.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Jones and carried, that the action of Mayor H. S. Joseph in settlement of the Anderson Offutt claim be ratified.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Long and carried, that the mayor be hereby authorized to arrange for the necessary funds to put in a deep well; also to ascertain the probable cost of such project.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Long and carried, that the mayor appoint a committee to investigate the advisability of the town purchasing the two lots adjoining the town hall and belonging to Harvard & Jones. The mayor appointed W. T. Smith, C. A. Long and P. Glaser.

Moved by Smith, seconded by Jones and carried, that the town take out a Workmen's Compensation and Employer's Liability Policy for one year in the Maryland Casualty Co., as per information submitted by Mr. Warner, at a cost of \$99.22 for said insurance for one year.

Moved by Jones, seconded by Long and carried, that the board adjourn.
