PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

AN ORDINANCE NO. 6.

An ordinance to amend the title and section 1 and 7 of and to add Section 9 to Ordinance No. 5 adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., September 1st, 1914, and entitled "An ordinance to regulate the sale of milk in the city of Opelousas, La., and providing penalties for the violation of its provisions."

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Chairman and Members of the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., that the title of Ordinance No. 5, adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., September 1st, 1914, be and is hereby amended to read as follows: "An ordinance to regulate the sale of milk and milk products in the City of Opelousas, La., and providing penalties for the violation of its provisions."

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that Section 1 of Ordinance No. 5 adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., September 1st, 1914, be and is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 1. Be it ordained by the Chairman and Members of the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., that no person, himself, or by his servant or agent, or as the agent or servant of another, shall sell or deliver or have in his possession or custody with the intent to sell or deliver

(1) Milk, or milk products to which water or foreign substance has been added. (2) Milk, or milk products not of the standard quality. (3) Milk which has been wholly or partly skimmed. (4) Milk or milk products containing any impurities which have not been removed.

(5) Milk or milk products produced by diseased cows or cows which have been fed unwholesome food or contaminated water, or (6) Milk or milk products which have been produced, stored, handled or transported in an improper, unclean or insanitary manner.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that Section 7 of Ordinance No. 5, adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., September 1st, 1914, be and is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., that whoever violates any provision of this ordinance, or any regulation made under its authority, and whoever hinders, obstructs or interferes with the Chairman of the Board of Health or any of his inspectors or assistants in the discharge of their duties, shall, on conviction, suffer the penalties as prescribed in Section 7 of Act 173 of 1912 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana."

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that the following section be added to and made apart of Ordinance No. 5, adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., September 1st, 1914, viz: "Section 9. Be it further ordained, etc., that the words "milk products" herein contained shall be construed to mean the products of dairies supplying the city of Opelousas with milk or cream, and shall include all products from such dairies, such as cheese, ice-cream, cream-cheese, butter, etc."

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that for good and sufficient cause, this ordinance shall take effect from date of its first publication. Adopted September 28th, 1915.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Chairman and Members of the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., that Section 3 of Ordinance No. 1, adopted by the Board of Health of the City of Opelousas, La., November 15th, 1913, be and is hereby amended to read as follows, viz:

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that for good and sufficient cause, this ordinance shall take effect from date of its first publication. Adopted September 28th, 1915.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that for good and sufficient cause, this ordinance shall take effect from date of its first publication. Adopted September 28th, 1915.

Opelousas, La., Oct. 7, 1915. To the Members of the Board of Aldermen, City of Opelousas, La.

Gentlemen: You are hereby notified that there will be a special meeting of the board held this afternoon, Oct. 7, 1915, at 5 o'clock, for the following purpose:

To consider proposition of Dietlein & Jacobs Gro. Co., for the purchase of a strip of land owned by the city on Cherry street acquired from Leonce Sandoz.

I received the above notice on the 7th day of Oct., 1915, and on the same day and date I notified all the Members of the Board in person.

Opelousas, La., Oct. 7, 1915. The Board of Aldermen met pursuant to the above call. Present: E. L. Loeb, Mayor, presiding; Aldermen Gosselin, Fields, and Danel. A quorum being present the meeting was called to order.

Mr. Danel offered the following resolution: Whereas, on the 31st day of May, 1907, as per Act No. 61-022, recorded in Conveyance Book "A" No. 4 1-2 page 479, records of this Parish, the City of Opelousas purchased from Leonce Sandoz a strip of land 60 feet wide, being the north side of said Sandoz' property beginning at the northern terminus of Cherry street and running east and west through said property to the property of Mrs. B. H. Pavy, and

Whereas, the city has used for the continuation of said Cherry street, a strip only 40 feet wide, the said Sandoz having removed his fence only 40 feet wide, and

Whereas, this city owns the remaining portion of said strip and not used for the continuation of Cherry street, being a strip 20 feet wide bounded on the north by said continuation of Cherry street, south by the Sandoz property recently purchased at probate sale by Dietlein & Jacobs, east by property of Fred Sandoz and west by property of Mrs. B. H. Pavy; and

Whereas, the said Dietlein & Jacobs offer to purchase for a consideration of one hundred and forty-one dollars cash, the said 20 foot strip; Be it therefore resolved, that the said 20 foot strip be sold to the said Dietlein & Jacobs for the consideration of one hundred and forty-one dollars cash; and that the Mayor of this municipality be and he is hereby authorized to sign, execute such deed as may be necessary for the sale of said property to the said Dietlein & Jacobs for the sum of one hundred and forty-one dollars cash.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Yeas: Gosselin, Fields and Danel. Nays: There being no further business before the Board the meeting was moved adjourned subject to call.
