AN ORDINANCE.

Whereas, a special election was held in the First Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, on the 30th day of June 1915, in accordance with an ordinance of the Police Jury of said Parish of St. Landry, adopted on the 3rd day of May 1915, and notice of same published according to law; and

Whereas, the question submitted at the said election was to determine the proposition: First, To authorize the First Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, through its governing authority to incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars, (\$25,000.00), to run for a period of 32 years, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually; the funds thus derived to be used for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing the public roads and bridges in said First Road District of the said Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana, acting through its governing authority, the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to incur debt to the amount of Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) and to make and to sign negotiable bonds therefor, numbered consecutively from One (1) to Twenty-eight (28), the first of which shall become due within one year and the last which shall mature in the year 1943; and which shall draw interest at the rate of five per cent per annum from date of issue, payable monthly on the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September with the interest coupon attached to each bond. And said bonds shall not be sold for less than the price now fixed by law.

Second, That when said bonds have been signed, issued, registered, and returned to the Secretary of State, the Police Jury shall be ready for negotiation and the President of the Police Jury is hereby authorized to sign and register the same.

Section 1. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry shall annually, at the same time as other tax levies, in accordance with law, in addition to all other taxes now authorized by the Constitution and laws, including any special tax, levy a tax above all said taxes sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds herein directed to be issued as they may mature; which tax may be levied, if not already levied, and extended on the assessment rolls at any time prior to the final collection of taxes due for that particular year; and when collected, shall be used for the purpose of retiring maturing bonds and interest coupons.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Secretary of the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, shall cause the original of this ordinance to be recorded in the office of the Secretary of State of Louisiana, and also published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official journal of the Parish of St. Landry, La., according to law and Act No. 256 of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1910, and amendments.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That said bonds shall be of date the 1st day of November 1915 and shall begin to mature on the First day of September A. D. 1916 and shall become due and payable each year thereafter until and including the First day of September 1943, and shall be in numbers and amounts as follows: Six bonds of the denomination of five hundred dollars each, due respectively on the First day of September of the year 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920 and 1921; Twenty-two bonds of the denomination of One Thousand Dollars each, each maturing respectively on the first day of September of the years 1922, 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938, 1939, 1940, 1941, 1942, and 1943.

And the form of said bond shall be substantially as follows, save as to number and amount and date of maturity:

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That when said bonds have been signed, issued, registered, and returned to the Secretary of State, the Police Jury shall be ready for negotiation and the President of the Police Jury is hereby authorized to sign and register the same.

Section 5. AN ORDINANCE.

Levying a special tax of ten mills on the dollar on all taxable property situated in the First Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, for the year 1915.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, in Regular Session convened; That whereas, a special election was held in the First Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, on the 30th day of June A. D. 1915, at which election was submitted the propositions as to whether said Road District, through its proper governing body, should be authorized to incur debt to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars, to run for a period of thirty-two years; and as to whether the governing authority of said Road District should be authorized to levy annually for a period of thirty-two years a special tax of not more than ten mills on the dollar, on all property subject to taxation in said District; and

Whereas, said propositions were duly carried and the result of said election duly canvassed and promulgated by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, on the 5th and 6th days of July A. D. 1915; and

Whereas, the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, the governing body of said Road District, has authorized the President and Secretary of its body to issue said bonds in accordance with the provisions of Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, adopted in 1898 and 1913 and Act No. 256 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1910, as amended by Act No. 218 of the General Assembly of said State for the year 1912, after an election on the 30th day of June 1915, on the question of such issue by the property taxpayers of said Road District, held canvassed and the results declared and promulgated and registered, all according to law authorizing such issue, of which election there was no contest and can none now lawfully be made.
