SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS

Opelousas, October 16th, 1915. The Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, met in special session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Dr. O. P. Daly, President, J. A. Perkins, H. D. Larcade, Jr., E. J. Andrepoint, R. L. Hawkins, Dr. L. J. Williams, Dr. A. C. Durio, Arthur Fogleman, W. B. Baker, J. W. Lyman and a quorum.

On motion of Mr. Lyman the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was dispensed with and the minutes as published were adopted.

On motion of Mr. Fogleman it was resolved to repeal the resolution passed on April 19th, 1913, creating and defining School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., and to create a new school district in its stead to be known and designated as School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., and to be defined and bounded as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the south-west corner of Section 17 in T-3-S, R-4-E., and running due North one and one half miles to the half Section line of Section 8, T-3-S, R-4-E.; thence running due west along the center line of Section 7, T-3-S, R-4-E., and Sections 11 and 12, T-3-S, R-3-E., to the west center line of Section 11, T-3-S, R-3-E.; thence running due north two and three quarter miles to a point one quarter of a mile north of the southwest corner of Section 26, T-2-S, R-3-E.; thence running due east six miles to a point one quarter of a mile north of the southeast corner of Section 27, T-2-S, R-4-E.; thence running due south to Bayou Waxia, being where it crosses the east line of Section 35, T-3-S, R-4-E.; thence running in a north-westerly direction, following the sinuosities of Bayou Waxia until it strikes the south line of Section 17, T-3-S, R-4-E.; thence running due west along the south line of said Section to point of beginning. The territory embraced in said district containing twenty-five and one quarter square miles.

Mr. Fogleman then introduced the following ordinances and moved their adoption:

Ordinance No. 2.
AN ORDINANCE.

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors and property taxpayers of school district the question of the levy of a special tax of five mills on the dollar, annually, for a period of thirty years, beginning with the year 1916, for the purpose of providing additional aid for the public schools in said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, That a special election be, and is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on the 27th day of November, 1915, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said school district entitled to vote thereat the question of a levy of a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all property in said school district subject to state taxation, for a period of thirty years, beginning with the year 1916, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the ballots to be used at said election shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy five mills special tax on all the property subject to taxation in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, annually for the period of thirty years, beginning with the year 1916, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

Signature of Voter.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, That the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, be, and he is hereby

ordered to cause to be prepared for use at the said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the compilation of the vote, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot boxes for use at the respective precincts, and to make provision for the transmission of the ballot boxes to the precinct at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That the precinct or polling place for the said election shall be Morrow, La., and the following three commissioners and clerk of election are appointed to said polling place: B. S. Haw, Ed. Morrow, C. F. Foster, commissioners, H. E. Lowery, clerk.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., That the Parish Board of School Directors shall meet at 12 o'clock A. M., on the 29th day of November, 1915, for the purpose, in open session, of examining and counting the returns, canvassing the returns and declaring the result of said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., That the President of the Parish Board of School Directors be, and he is hereby instructed to give public notice of said election by proclamation to be duly published according to law, in the following form:

PROCLAMATION.
Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, at its special meeting held on the 16th of October, 1915, I, Oliver P. Daly, President of said Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, on the 27th day of November, 1915, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition, to-wit:

To levy a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all the property in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of thirty years, beginning with the year of 1916, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be Morrow, La., and the following commissioners and clerk of election at said polling place have been appointed to serve at said election: B. S. Haw, Ed. Morrow, C. F. Foster, commissioners, H. E. Lowery clerk.

At said special election the polls will open at seven o'clock A. M. and close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at 12 o'clock A. M., on the 29th day of November, 1915, the said Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, will meet at Opelousas, Louisiana, and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said special election.

Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., That the special election herein provided for shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof shall be made under the provisions of Act 256 of 1910 and amendments thereof, and such other laws as may be applicable.

Ordinance No. 3.
AN ORDINANCE.

Ordering a special election in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said school district the question of a bond issue of Ten Thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), the proceeds of said issue to be used to procure a site and provide for the erection and equipment of a school building at Morrow, in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana; and,

Whereas, It is the voluntary will of this body to call the election hereinafter provided for, and

Whereas, Article 281 of the Constitutions of 1898 and 1913, and Act 256 of the Legislature of 1910, as amended by Act 218 of 1912, declares the

School Board of the Parish of St. Landry to be the governing authority through which the said school district may incur debt and issue negotiable bonds for such purposes when so authorized at an election to be held in the said district; and,

Whereas, the assessed valuation of the said district amounts to Two hundred and thirty-eight thousand two hundred and seventy dollars (\$238,270.00) and the existing bonded indebtedness incurred under Article 281 of the Constitutions of 1898 and 1913, amounting to Nothing dollars (\$0 0 0) added to the proposed indebtedness does not exceed the Constitutional limit of ten per cent of the assessed valuation; and,

Whereas, the special tax necessary to be levied annually to extinguish the proposed indebtedness will approximate five mills, which added to the existing special taxes annually levied under Article 281 of the Constitutions of 1898 and 1913, to extinguish indebtedness incurred under said Article will not exceed the Constitutional limit of ten mills per annum on the dollar of assessed valuation of the property of said district; now therefore,

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, in lawful session convened, That an election shall be, and is hereby called to be held in the said School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, on the 27th day of November, 1915, at which election the majority of the property taxpayers of the said district, in number and amount, eligible to vote and voting shall determine the

Proposition to incur debt and issue bonds of the said School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, to the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to run for a period of twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually; the funds thus derived to be used for the purpose of procuring a site and provide for the erection and equipment of a school building at Morrow in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the ballot boxes, necessary blanks and other paraphernalia shall be provided by the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and he shall cause to be printed ballots for use in said election, in the following form, to-wit:

Proposition to incur debt and issue bonds of said School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, to the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), to run for twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually, for the purpose of procuring a site and provide for the erection and equipment of a school building at Morrow in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana. Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., That said election shall be held at Morrow at the usual polling place. The following three commissioners and clerk are appointed to this polling place: B. S. Haw, Ed. Morrow, C. F. Foster, commissioners, H. E. Lowery, clerk.	NO

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., That notice of this election containing the proposition herein submitted to the voters shall be prepared and signed by the President and Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors and shall be published by the Secretary in the official journal by four weekly insertions, the date of the first insertion to be thirty (30) days before the date of the election.

And said notice shall further recite that on November 29th, 1915, the first legal day following said election, at 12 o'clock M., the Parish Board of School Directors will meet at the office of said board, in said parish, and there in open session open the ballot boxes, examine and canvass the re-

turns and declare the result of said election, and promulgate the same. Unanimously adopted.

Proposition to incur debt and issue bonds of the said School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, to the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), to run for a period of twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent (5 per cent) per annum, payable annually, the funds thus derived to be used for the

Purpose of procuring a site and to provide for the erection and equipment of a school building at Morrow in School District No. 4 of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana.

The said election shall be held at Morrow at the usual polling place, and the following commissioners and clerk of election are appointed to said polling place: B. S. Haw, Ed. Morrow, C. F. Foster, commissioners; H. E. Lowery, clerk, each being a registered voter.

Notice is hereby further given that on the 29th day of November, 1915, the first legal day following such election, at 12 o'clock M., the Parish Board of School Directors will meet at the office of said body, in said Parish, and there in public open session, open the ballot boxes, and examine and declare the result of the election and promulgate the same.

Given on this, the 16th day of October, 1915, at Opelousas, Louisiana, in said parish.
