LICENSE ORDINANCE

An ordinance for the levying and collecting of Parish Licenses for the year 1916: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry in regular session convened:

Section 1. That the license laws of the State of Louisiana now in force shall in so far as applicable be the license ordinance of the Parish of St. Landry for the year 1916, except as hereinafter modified and changed:

Section 2. That the annual license for peddlers and hawkers in one and two horse vehicles shall be \$15.00 and \$20.00 respectively;

Section 3. That the amount to be paid as an annual license tax by retail dealers in distilled, alcoholic and malt liquors shall be graded as follows:

First Class: When the gross annual sales shall be \$30,000.00 or more, the license shall be \$2,500.00;

Second Class: When the gross annual sales shall be less than \$30,000.00 and not more than \$20,000.00 the license shall be \$2,000.00;

Third Class: When the gross annual sales shall be less than \$20,000.00 and not more than \$10,000.00, the license shall be \$1,500.00;

Fourth Class: When the gross annual sales shall be \$10,000.00 or less, the license shall be \$800.00;

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect on and after January 1st, 1916. Adopted Dec. 6th, 1915. FRANK DIMMICK, President.

ANNUAL TAX ORDINANCE

Whereas, by resolution adopted on October 4th, 1915, this body framed a budget of Eighty-One Thousand Three Hundred and Twenty-Six and 20-100 Dollars, (\$81,326.20), as an estimate exhibiting the various items of expenditure that the parish of St. Landry would require for the year 1916, and

Whereas, said budget has been published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official newspaper of this parish, for the full term of thirty (30) days as the law directs, and

Whereas, an ad valorem tax of ten (10) mills on the dollar of the taxable property of this parish will be required in addition to the revenues to be derived under the license ordinance adopted to meet said budget;

Now therefore, Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of St. Landry, that a tax of ten (10) mills on the dollar be, and is hereby, levied on all taxable property situated within this parish on which the State levies a tax, to meet said budget of expenditures for the year 1916.

AN ORDINANCE

Number Eight of Nineteen Fifteen.

Providing for the levying of a license tax upon all persons, associations of persons, firms or corporations, conducting the business of retail liquor dealers, within the corporate limits of the City of Opelousas, La., for the year 1916, grading same, and providing penalties for the violation hereof.

Section One: Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La., That there shall be, and there is hereby levied upon all person, firms, corporations or associations of persons, engaged in the retail liquor business for the year 1916, the following license, to-wit:

Class "A": When the gross annual receipts of said business shall be one hundred thousand dollars and over seventy-five thousand dollars the annual license shall be three thousand dollars.

Class "B": When the gross annual receipts are seventy-five thousand dollars and more than forty thousand dollars the annual license shall be two thousand dollars.

Class "C": When the gross annual receipts are less than forty thousand dollars the annual license shall be eight hundred dollars; provided that no license shall be issued under this ordinance for less than eight hundred dollars except as provided for by existing state laws to dealers in malt and vinous liquors.

Section Two: Be it further ordained, etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, or contrary hereto, be and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

Number Nine of Nineteen Fifteen.

To provide an annual revenue for the City of Opelousas, La., by levying an annual tax upon all the property situated within the corporate limits of said city, not exempt from taxation under the Laws and Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and providing the manner of enforcing the payment of same.

Section One: Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Opelousas, La., that for the year 1916 there is hereby levied a tax of ten (10) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of all the property situated within the limits of the City of Opelousas, La., except such as is exempt from taxation under the Constitution and laws of the State, three (3) mills of the aforesaid tax being hereby dedicated to the payment of the Street Improvement Bond Issue by the City of Opelousas, and payable out of the taxes of said city for the year 1916.

Section Two: Be it further ordained, etc., That said taxes shall be due and collectible in accordance with the Constitution and laws of this State and particularly Act 136 of 1898 and laws mandatory thereto.

Section Three: Be it further ordained, etc., That this ordinance shall take effect from and after its publication in the official journal.

Section Four: Be it further ordained, etc., That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith or contrary thereto, be and the same are hereby repealed.
