SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS

Opelousas, La., Dec. 6th, 1915. The Parish Board of School Directors met in special session pursuant to adjournment. Present: Perkins, Larcade, Horaist, Durio, Fogleman, Carriere, Fontenot, Baker, Lyman, Guidry and a quorum. The President being absent, the Vice President, Mr. Carriere, called the meeting to order and presided over same. Secretary C. J. Thompson being absent on account of continued illness, Mr. Baker moved the election of W. B. Prescott Secretary Pro Tem. Carried. On motion of Mr. Lyman the reading of the minutes of the last meeting was dispensed with and the minutes as published were adopted. Mr. Perkins, seconded by Mr. Baker, moved the adoption of the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 5

An Ordinance Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said school district the question of levying a special tax of two and one-half mills (\$0.025) for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That a special election be, and is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on the 11th day of January, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote thereat the question of a levy of a special tax of two and one-half mills (\$0.025) on the dollar on all property subject to State taxation, for a period of five years, the proceeds of said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the ballots to be used at said election shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and shall be in the following form: Proposition to levy a two and one-half mills (\$0.025) special tax on all the property subject to taxation in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., annually, for a period of five years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district. Taxable Valuation \$..... Notice to Voters: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (x) mark in the square after the word "Yes"; to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "No."

Section 3. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors be, and he is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for use at said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the compilation of the vote, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot box for the use at the precinct, and to make provision for the transmission of the box to the precinct at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the polling place at said election shall be at the Court House at Opelousas, La., and H. D. Larcade, Sr., F. J. Hardy and J. H. Harmanson are appointed commissioners and Ludovic Fontenot, clerk of election.

Section 5. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the President of the Parish Board of School Directors be, and he is hereby instructed to give public notice of said election by proclamation to be duly published, according to law in the following form: Unanimously carried: PROCLAMATION. Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., at a special meeting held on the 6th day of December, 1915, I, J. G. Carriere, Vice President of said Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition, to-wit: To levy a special tax of two and one-half mills (\$0.025) on the dollar on all the property in school District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of five years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

For the purpose of said election the polling place will be at the Court House at Opelousas, La., and the following commissioners and clerks have been appointed to serve at said election, H. D. Larcade, Sr., F. J. Hardy, J. H. Harmanson; Ludovic Fontenot. At said election the poll will open at seven o'clock A. M. and will close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto. Notice is also given that at 11 o'clock A. M., on the 13th day of January, 1916, the said Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., will meet at the School Board Office, Opelousas, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said special election. This 6th day of December, 1915. J. G. CARRIERE, Vice-President of Parish Board of School Directors. Section 7. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the special election herein and herein provided for shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof shall be made under the provisions of Act 256 of 1910 and amendments thereof, and such other laws as may be applicable. Carried. Mr. Lyman moved that the bills for \$88.65 and \$40.00 be approved and ordered paid from the special funds of the Eunice School District. Carried. Mr. Horaist was called to the chair and Mr. Carriere offered the following resolution: That the Catholic community of Grand Prairie be allowed the use of the High School Building for the purpose of holding a fair in the near future. Roll call: For, Carriere; against, Perkins, Larcade, Horaist, Durio, Fogleman, Fontenot, Baker, Lyman. Lost. Mr. Perkins moved that the letter of Mr. Sledge, Principal of the Grand Prairie School be published in the minutes. Carried. Washington, La., Dec. 4, 1915. To the Parish School Board: There has been a number of entertainments given in the Grand Prairie High School building during the past short while, and each time there has been some trouble raised by

the boys. These entertainments were given strictly for the benefit of the school, but we have been discussing the advisability of allowing the building to be used for such purposes, even though the school receives the entire proceeds. It is the opinion of the majority of the school officials that all public gatherings except regular programs given by the school as a part of their school work should be dispensed with. E. M.
