REV. FATHER PETER O. LEBEAU DEAD.

Palmetto, La., Dec. 29.—This community was shocked beyond expression when the news of the death of Father P. O. Lebeau was learned here today.

He died early Monday morning in the Hotel Dieu at New Orleans.

Father Lebeau had lived more than fifteen years in Palmetto, La., and labored much in a spiritual way for the betterment and uplift of the people.

His Christian character endeared him to all, both Catholic and Protestant, for he had nothing but kindness and good for all.

He was the builder of St. Anthony's Catholic Church at this place and established two mission schools here, under the direction of the colored Catholic Missionary Society of Baltimore, Md.

His body is expected to arrive from New Orleans late Wednesday evening and will lie in state in the church until Thursday when interment will be made in the beautiful little cemetery not far from the church, it being his expressed wish that his body should rest here until the great resurrection morn.

The funeral will be attended by many from far off places, and never in the history of this place will there be more sorrow expressed, than at the grave of Rev. Father P. O. Lebeau.

ORDINANCE NO. 5

An Ordinance Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said school district the question of the levy of a special tax of two and one-half mills (\$0.025) for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That a special election be, and is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on the 11th day of January, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote thereat the question of a levy of a special tax of two and one-half mills (\$0.025) on the dollar on all property subject to State taxation, for a period of five years, the proceeds of said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of St. Landry, La., That the ballots to be used at said election shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a two and one-half mills (\$0.025) special tax on all the property subject to taxation in School District No. 1 of the 1st Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., annually, for a period of five years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said school district.

Notice to Voters: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (x) mark in the square after the word "Yes"; to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "No."
